BOMBARDMEMT OF ALICANTE.

(From the "Impacrial.") Alicante Sept 27th.

At 4 o'clock this morning the reveillée was sounded in the streets, and before suntise we were drawn up on the beach under Gen. Coballos and the War-Minister Maisonave, who had arranged everything last night at the various forts to resist the bombardment by the Communist frigates. The English, French and German ironclads were already getting up steam, and by 6 o'clock slowly proceeded out of port to allow the pirates to draw close in and shell our town. Just then the Fernando Catolico camé in sight, returning from her cruise of yesterday to Villajoyosa, where the townpeople were forced to pay \$2,000 to provide fresh supplies for the pirates on board

At 6.20 the frontlads Numancia and Mendez Nuñez took up positions, close to the frigate Fernando, firing two signal shots. At 7 a. m. the Numancia threw the first shell into the fort. which replied with 5 shots, the gunners crying out " Viva España y Alicante." Then the din and confusion of a fierce bombardment succeeded without intermission for some hours. the Numancia the Fernando hauled away out of range, leaving the irouclads to deal with us. The fire was so coal-tail, and another had his leg taken off by a 66 pound shot.




