RIGHT OF EMISSION

The debate in the Provincial Chambers as to the propriety of the Provincial Bank receiving the notes of the promised National Bank seems to have been strongly in the affirmative, and some of the Deputies are said to have expressed the opinion that there is no law prohibiting any of the other Banks in this city from issuing their own notes, under properly defined guarantees to be sanctioned by the Executive.

Meantime the course of events has greatly changed everything since the Provincial Bank law was last reformed by the Chambers. At that time there was no other Bank in B. Ayres, now there are 2 English, 2 Argentine 1 Brazilian, 1 German, 1 Italian, 1 Spanish, all representing a large capital and fair amount of business.

It is true that the Bank of England allows no other Bank in the city of London to emit notes, but if this principle were correct in itself we should never have seen the glorious result of free-banking in Scotland, which has converted a poor, remote, thinly peopled province of the U. Kingdom into one of the most flourishing countries in Europe, making the Clyde rival the Mersey or the Thames in commercial activity, and transforming Scott's and Macaulay's cattle-lifters of the last century into the merchant-princes and manufacturers of the present day.

we have nine. If we look, however, at Boston, with less trade, population and shipping than Buenos Ayres, we find over twenty Banks in that city, the right of emission being denied to none.

It is not our duty or inclination to draw up the terms on which the right of emission should be conceded to the various Banks in Buenos Ayres. Let the several managers put their heads together, and frame a project which they think will serve the public interests and those of the Banks, with reasonable guarantees for their notes, and we think the Legislature of Buenos Ayres shows itself liberal and enlightened enough to do away with any real or imaginary prohibitions.

PARIS GOSSIP.

The relations between Italy and Germany continue to occupy the most prominent topic of conversation. The journey of Victor Emmanuel to Berlin has grieved without surprising French liberals, who in 1849 however inaugurated the expeditions to Rome. They roundly accuse the intrigues for restoring Henri V. as the cause of forcing an ally and a friend into the arms of an hereditary enemy.

The failure of the fusion is a true bill, and the coalition has only prolonged the unpopular provisional to propose. There is no objection to continuing MacMahon, perhaps it is not so easy a matter to remove him, provided the general elections come off, and universal suffrage be not emancipated. It is to the new electoral then that all eyes are directed.

A hint for mothers. In addition to having the keys, a scissors and no end of what not suspended from her waist, she must now have a balance graduated on a scale of ounces and pounds.

The most eminent medical authority on infants' growth and diseases lays down that the only sure test to ascertain whether a baby be in good health and well cared by its nurse is to weigh it frequently. The following is the scale: a baby at the end of five months ought to weigh double what it did when only seven days old, and at sixteen months double what it did at five; in the former period the rate of increase is about three-quarters of an ounce daily, in the latter half an ounce. Scales or balances, with graduated registers to record the infant's development, are now advertised. "My dear, have you weighed the children to-day?" must for the future be one anxiety more for Paternfamilias.

THE ASHANTEE EXPEDITION.

London, Sept. 26th. The material for the railway continues to arrive at the Royal Arsenal, Woolwich, for shipment, and to judge by the engines and waggons sent with the rails, it will be of the ordinary 4ft. gauge. Several additional tons of railway iron were delivered yesterday, and the newest of the two engines was packed ready for embarkation. Iron saw benches on wheels and other appliances for constructing steam saw mills on the African coast were also delivered, with other machinery for expediting the work of the artificers who will be employed in the expedition.

The naval medical arrangements for the approaching African campaign are as yet in a formative state, especially as regards the number of extra surgeons who may be detailed for service with the expedition. There is already a full staff, even for Africa, of medical officers at the seat of war, and they will be at once reinforced if there should be any extraordinary amount of sickness, or if Sir Garnet Wolseley, on his arrival, should think it advisable. A very large quantity of quinine and other drugs, and a liberal provision of preserved meats, soups, medical comforts, and luxuries of all descriptions for the sick are being despatched. The Simoon is now on the coast as a hospital ship for the seamen and marines, and as ships go, no better could have been selected for the purpose.

series of encounters in the African bush, in which there can be no opportunity for an open contest, must be equally unsatisfactory for the General and for his troops. If it gives any pleasure to military spectators and critics, it can be only on the principle that half a loaf is better than no bread, and that to fight against savages is better than not to fight at all. For those who have to take part in such a war, and for those who will find themselves compelled to pay for it, the affair is simply lamentable. It is not likely, indeed, that either of the two will fail in their respective duties. We have a right, from long experience, to assume that our soldiers will be brave, and we have the same right to assume that our taxpayers will be submissive. We would wish only that our soldiers' courage could be employed in a better cause, and that our proverbial patience of financial burdens could be less unprofitably exemplified. For those who are to be sent out, and for those who are to stay at home, the Ashantee war will be a deplorable necessity, and not the less so when they consider by what means it has come about, and how easily a short time ago, by the exercise of a little judgment and forethought, the whole matter might have been avoided.

EDITOR'S TABLE.

The Royal Mail steamer Tiber will sail to-morrow for Old England. Letters and newspapers can be posted at the Capitanía up to the usual hour, and the various English libraries have a full supply of stamps and STANDARD Packet Editions on hand. The state of the river prevents the Tiber sailing to-day.

The note question between the National and Provincial Banks is expected to be settled in the way that common sense and the interest of the community demand. In the course of the discussion in the Chambers on Tuesday the subject of emission by the private banks was touched on, and a Deputy stated that the Law, as it stands, allows them all to emit notes if they wish. This is of vital importance at the present stringent moment, as an emission by the private banks on suitable guarantees would afford ample and speedy relief to our money market, which is now stretched to its utmost tension. No legitimate business on the face of the earth can afford to pay the enormous rates for money that have been current in B. Ayres for the past six months.

The Bourgogne from Marseilles and the Astarte from Glasgow entered port yesterday morning. The news by both these steamers has been anticipated by the Sorata's mails. A smart man at Chivilcoy put arsenic in a bottle of wine, hoping that a burglar would drink it, and his wife placed it among 100 other bottles. The smart man is now wondering which is the bottle. We are requested to announce to the Scotch community of this city that their highly esteemed pastor, the Rev. James Smith, will perform Divine service at Quilmes on Sunday afternoon next, at 4 o'clock, in the house of Mr. Robert Muir. In consequence of this arrangement there will be no evening service at the Scotch Church in this city on that day.

The great land auction at Saavedra, near the People's Park, is to come off on Saturday (V.V.W.P.). It is held on this day (a holiday) so that English and German residents who may object to Sunday auctions can attend without doing violence to their religious convictions. The lots to be sold are really in a most enviable situation, and a large attendance, with brisk bidding, may be looked for. When things right themselves in the money market it is as certain as the moon shines that lots picked up now in this or any other suburb of the city will greatly increase in value. Another splendid chance for land buyers will be Mr. Chapeaurouge's sale in Calle Santa Fe, on Sunday next. This splendid thoroughfare is manifestly destined to be the Glamps Elysees of Buenos Ayres at no very distant day, and the property to be sold on Sunday is one of the finest along it.

Good news for the numerous beings who declare themselves 'passionately fond of Music!' The Buenos Ayres Glee Club will give its second and final concert for the season within the next ten days, at the Coliseum, exact date and programme to be published in a day or two. We are open to an offer of a ticket, and opine there are 'a good few' of the same mind. Signor Colonne, 'the white haired boy' of the present opera troupe with the public of B. Ayres, took his benefit at the Colon Theatre on Tuesday evening. The house was nearly as full as on the occasion of Madame Pozzoni's benefit. We need not speak of Signor Colonne's rendering of his 'role' in the opera—Un Ballo in Maschera—it has already been lauded by all the critics in town. During the first three acts of the opera the 'beneficere' shared thunders of applause with Madame Pozzoni, but as the opera concluded with the baritone 'romanza,' he had the last all to himself, poor Madame Pozzoni being suddenly attacked with illness when the curtain fell on the previous act, and quite unable to resume her role. When the curtain rose and discovered the public favourite alone on the stage, the enthusiasm of the audience burst out in one tremendous hurrah! and clapping of hands, continued for several minutes. The 'romanza' was sung splendidly and then came the presents. First a handsome boy, dressed as a sailor, (the son of a leading German merchant) came on the stage with a bouquet in one hand and casket in the other. Sr.

Colonne bowed gratefully to the house several times and shook hands with the child amidst vociferous cheering from all parts of the "salle". Then entered six of the male 'corps de ballet' each with his arms full of wreaths, jewel cases, and bouquets, the baritone taking each gift in turn in his hands and advancing to the footlights to bow his thanks. Five times was the curtain raised and lowered before the audience were satisfied, and we were afraid the popular baritone would have to make a speech, but his admirers contented themselves with "one cheer more". The 'ballet' followed, and then a scena from Don Carlos, magnificently sung and acted by the hero of the night. Three more summonses before the curtain, while "the house rose at him", concluded the ovation to this justly popular singer.

The Montevideo cable is still interrupted. The Wire is now a days like money or an average good wife; we never know its value till we lose it. There is a lame leg kind of feeling in business circles here while the cable is not at work. Great events may be passing at the Mount, or news from Europe may have set the Bourse there on fire, while Buenos Ayres is condemned to wait for a steamer to bring it up, and is not certain even of that. In a few days we hope to hear that all is right again.

The next move of the C.B.A. Tramway Company will be cars from Plaza Victoria to the Plaza Once every twenty minutes. Up San Martin to a junction at Oyo, and up Oyo to the Once will be the route.

MAN ABOUT TOWN.

Pursuing our way down Calle Postol in search of the useful or interesting we were brought to a stand at the corner of Balcarce by a monstrous piece of machinery just then being rolled into the warehouses of Messrs. John Findlay and Co.

This large machinery firm of Pountney Lane, London, recently established here under the able direction of Mr. John Findlay, jr., is already well and favorably known among our local manufacturers. All the iron cranes on the customs wharf have also been specially designed by Mr. Findlay.

But a joint idea can be formed of the large capital invested in this business. The central deposit or sample warehouse is a world in itself. In one corner is an assortment of steam engines from 2 to 20 horse power, including vertical, horizontal and portable with their corresponding boilers. These engines are constructed for the necessities of this country, comprising simplicity, durability, and for effecting the greatest economy of fuel.
