RIGHT OF EMISSION

The debate in the Provincial Cham-

ers as to the propriety of the Provinpromised National Bank seems to have some of the Deputies are said to have in this city from issuing their own notes, under properly defined guarantees to be sanctioned by the Executive. This would seem to confirm a state ment that one of our foreign Banks the same effect. Nevertheless the impression has always prevailed here that the Provincial Bank had a mon opoly of emission, and if there were not grounds for such belief it is strange that the Mana, River Plate and Argentine Banks have so long emitted elsewhere, without attempting to push their right to do so in B. Avres.

Meantime the course of events has greatly changed everything since the Provincial Bank law was last reformed by the Chambers. At that time there was no other Bank in B. Ayres, now there are 2 English, 2 Argentine 1 Brazilian, 1 German, 1 Italian, 1 Spanish, all representing a large capital and fair amount of business. Moreover the monopoly, if any, in favor of the Provincial Bank has been swept away by the decree of Congress giving to the National Bank' the right of emission. It therefore remains for us to consider on what footing our banking business is to be now placed. Are we to have two privileged Banks instead of one, or is the system of free trade to be extended to this as to other

branches of commerce? Banks before now have collapsed grief in the United States and Band. Oriental, bringing wholesale ruin and discredit. Just as steamboats have burst on the Mississippi and elsewhere. com over pressure. But in this age we can neither do without Banks no. steamboats; and if we want to avoid calamities it depends upon the strict regulation and due order of things. It is admitted that the right of emission to private Banks, under proper guarantees, would be equally advantageous to the trade of B. Ayres and the Banks, while there seems no ade quate reason for with-holding it.

It is true that the Bank of England allows no other Bank in the city of London to emit notes, but if this principle were correct in itself we should never have seen the glorious result or free-banking in Scotland, which has converted a poor, remote, thinly peopled province of the U. Kingdom into one of the most flourishing countries in Europe, making the Clyde rival the Mersey or the Thames in commercia. activity, and transforming Scott's and Macauley's cattle-lifters of the last entury into the merchant-princes and manufacturers of the present day.

The effect has been no less magican the U. States, where immigration. railways and banks have been the triple power that elevated a country within the memory of people living from the rank of Portugal or Canada to be the great rival of Britain and second to no country that the work has yet seen in the great characteris tics and figures that make up a nation.

If we look at the converse proposi tion we shall see that those nation: where banking is undeveloped are a prey to sloth, misery and degradation n the same manner as education i backward wherever the Press has not healthy vitality.

There are some who go halt-way in their regard for Banks, and say that they are a good thing which we may have too much of. For example, two or three Banks would be highly bene deial to the Argentine Republic, but fifty would be ruinous. This is a ques tion of detail that we cannot go into is it would be impossible to arrive a the precise number of Banks where utility would end and prejudice begin But we may feel assured that with Banks, as with newspapers, the public will support as many as it requires. And as the trade and population of the country are doubling every ten years, we shall have more Banks every year. Nor is our present number in Buenos

Your Excellency's Administrator has taken possession of all and every article of value belonging to the colonists, (even my private property), and yet Your Excellency has failed to afford the slightest aid in the removal of the colonists, nor have the Government sent one pound of provision to avert starvation. I beg To the Editors of the STAND ARD. to apologize to Your Excellency when I assert that it is an unparalleld instance in the annuls of the civilized world that a nation in amity as Paraguay is with Great Britain should thus ignore all the ties of humanity,

here. Certainly it cannot be Your Excellency's desire that Paraguay should be pointed out as a nation that has disregarded every tie of humanity and civilization. The gallant and generous people of the neighbouring Argentine Republic have directly, on colony, raised subscriptions to aid in Excellency the President's considera-I feel assured that the unfortunate son is not to be found in the whole English bondholders of the Paraguayan loan, of which I am one, would gladly allow a portion of their money to be expended in rescuing from starvation their countrymen in Paraguay.
