There has never been a time for the last half-century when the Bank could not have redeemed every note in circulation, short of the general bankruptcy of its clients; but the attempt to maintain this position would at various times have undoubtedly done all but produce the uncomfortable result alluded to: and hence the periodical suspension of the act limiting its issues, which obviated general insolvency. We appear now closely approaching such a conjuncture as has hitherto preluded Government interference, but it is very doubtful if the Bank will move a step to ask a repetition of a course of much less importance to itself than to others. It will quietly pursue the plan it has adopted of borrowing on its 3 per cents, an operation that at present[costs it rather over 6 per cent in contangoes and commissions for money it now in many cases uses at 8 per cent., whilst if the future is rightly understood, either in the Bank parlour or out of it, it will be able by-andby to replace them at a good turn. 
