There was a shine in Calle Parque the other night. A dutiful son living at No. 53, allowed himself a little exercise before going to bed in the way of rubbing his mother.

We heard yesterday from a medical friend that the examination of students of the Faculty of Medicine is going on in the most creditable and satisfactory manner for all concerned.

The National Government has received a despatch from that at Asuncion, answering its memorandum on the territory in dispute between the two countries.

All the foreigners in the country are becoming Argentines. A baker's dozen of them applied for naturalization papers yesterday.

The row at the Corro on Tuesday did not amount to much; butcher's bill only one killed, three wounded, and several missing; some say the first is only half killed, but there is no doubt about the missing having mizzled.

Great news from Cordoba. The telegrams yesterday from the holy city state that the people up there are tired of politics, and are settling down to work.

Report for Half-Year ended June, 1873. 1. The gross receipts of the railway for the half-year have been £102,032 £51,948

2. The increase in the gross receipts of the line for the half-year is £20,084 or equal to 24.50 per cent., and the increase in the net profits is £10,387 or 30.79 per cent.

3. The working expenses amount to 56.76 per cent., as compared with 58.84 in 1872.

4. The receipts from passenger traffic show an increase of 29.95 per cent., and the receipts from goods traffic an increase of 39.98 per cent.

5. The receipts per train mile have been 12s 10d in 1873, as against 12s 2d in 1872, and the expense of working per train mile has been 7s 3d as compared with 7s 2d in the previous half-year.

6. The general manager, Mr. Cooper, reports as follows, under date August 15th, 1873:— Passenger Traffic. This traffic for the six months ending June, 1873, shows the following comparative results:—

The increase in numbers is due in a great measure to the cheap excursion tickets issued on Sundays and Holidays.

These tickets are issued at a considerably lower price than the ordinary ones, and the percentage of increase in receipts being more than equal to that in numbers is accounted for by the opening of forty miles more line, bringing in longer fares.

The connection with the Buenos Ayres and Ensenada Railway has not yet given any important result, and so long as the fares by that route are higher than those by the Plaza Constitucion and Tramway, it cannot be expected to yield such favourable returns as it would otherwise do.

A new station 'Banfield' was opened on May 4th, between Lanus and Lomas de Zamora.

The gross receipts from the traffic amount to £55,936 as against £39,960 in 1872, equal to an increase of 39.98 per cent.

Stations have been renewed with steel rails and cast-iron sleepers. Additional accommodation has been provided, both in shed room and in sidings, at Buenos Ayres and Barracas, and at some other stations.

The bridges and culverts are in fair order. Some repairs have been done during the half-year by changing the old timber rail bearers or bridges, and substituting wrought-iron ones made of Barlow rail, and this will shortly have to be done throughout the Samborombon bridge.

The abutments of the Salado Bridge have been altogether taken away, and new ones rebuilt in their places, with good machine bricks from the Company's yard at Bursaco; the ends of the girders have also been placed upon rollers to allow of expansion without straining the brickwork.

The brick yard at Bursaco has been closed, the great length of carriage over the line making it unprofitable to employ the machine bricks on the extensions; good handmade bricks, manufactured close to where wanted, and the plant for which can be easily removed, being considered better.

Notwithstanding that the traffic of the last three months in the half-year has been very light, owing chiefly to the dearth of money, and the consequent stoppage of trade, the result has been an improvement on the corresponding period of 1872.

It is hoped that the reduction in goods rates and passenger fares, which takes effect from 1st October next, will secure a considerable increase of traffic at once, while there is no doubt of the eventual good to be derived from the operation.

There is no apparent reason why the present half-year should not be a satisfactory one—the traffic since the 1st July has been good.

The foregoing report of the general manager explains fully the operations of the railway during the past half-year.

The length of line open for traffic was 146 miles, against 106 miles in the corresponding period of 1872.

The construction of the Dolores extension is being proceeded with; good progress has been made with the earthworks, and a large quantity of permanent-way materials, &c. has already been shipped.

As indicated in their last general report, the Board have had a careful enquiry made as to the character and extent of the opposition carried on against the railway by the bullock carts. The fact of a very large volume of traffic being conveyed by the carts is fully confirmed, and the local committee and general manager are of opinion that by a reasonable reduction of existing rates, a large and profitable addition can be made to the traffic of the railway.

After providing for all the Debenture and Interest charges of the half-year, the net revenue shows a balance of £37,574, out of which the Board recommend the payment of an interim dividend of 7s per share—free of Income-tax—equal to 7 per cent. per annum. This will absorb £34,992.

The Board have to announce with deep regret the death, in June last, of their late Chairman, Lord Marjoribanks. His lordship presided over the Board from the establishment of the Company with a most anxious and single-minded desire to promote in every way the success of the undertaking, and the Board desire to record their sense of the great loss which they and the Company have sustained.

This was a dull day on 'Change, and a small attendance of merchants. Everyone looks for the Garonne and her news from London, and the interest has been enhanced owing to the rumours of certain telegrams having come at the moment to Lisbon for the Niger of the most important nature.

After a long pause there is a stir in National Bonds. The sales were: National Bonds, For cash 12,000 77. Saturday 6,500 76 1/2.

Exchange ruled to-day at 49, and for bank paper 49 1/2. Something was also done on London in the afternoon at 49, and on Antwerp 6.36. It was said on 'Change that gold will go forward by the Galles.

Mr. Nipp, who has just returned from Europe, was welcomed on 'Change to-day. There was some enquiry to-day about the new export company, of which Mr. Krug will be the manager.

The regular quarterly amortization of the Hypothecary Bank mortgages has taken place, but as yet we have not seen the numbers. The amount amortized, we believe is 50,000 patacons.

It is probable that arrangements will be concluded shortly so that next year the National Bank can draw exchange on the London market. A move in the right direction.

A real estate broker informs us that some chacras were sold to-day to emigrant passengers arriving by Niger. This is a new feature, and of such importance as to call for further particulars.

It is reported to-day that two more lighters went down in the canals of the Boca; of course it is useless calling attention to the matter; day after day we have the same news, lighters blocked up, lighters gone down, in fact lighters on top of lighters; there is no one to look after the matter, and the best plan would be for the lighter-men to give up the Boca in toto.

Wool ruled a little down in the Onco, spite of the fact that the plaza is almost empty and the station has very little; everything offered this morning sold at about 72, but buyers are holding back waiting for the Garonne news. It is generally feared that the rate will be 10 per cent for money in London.

The National publishes the following sales by Mr. Urduinon, auctioneer, which is important: 6,356 sheep valued at 225 m/c, sold for 833. 822 cows 150 do 107 1/2.

On Friday, by order of the Italian Consul, some 800 tons coal will be sold by auction in Montevideo. The John Elder entered Montevideo yesterday. Sr. Fernando Rocha and family left in her for Rio Janeiro.

The Chilean mails bring the following advices from Valparaiso: Dec. 3, 1873. Numerous arrivals of seeking tonnage, and rates gave way, but as the demand was active, a re-action has taken place, and the market closes firm at the following quotations:—£2 17s 6d wheat, Valparaiso Bay to Liverpool; £2 15s to £2 17s 6d copper produce to Liverpool or Swansea; £2 17s 6d to £3 6s, nitrate, Iquique to Liverpool; £3 2s 6d to £3 7s 6d to £3 10s nitrate, Iquique to United Kingdom or Continent; £3 10s nitrate, Iquique to New York.

"The captain of the British barque Athol reports that on September 26th, when 300 miles to the north-east of the Falkland Islands, he spoke the Gipsy Queen, from Swansea for Valparaiso, 60 days out, with mainmast gone. "Vessels at the Falklands—The captain of the British steamer Ciudad, from the Falklands, reports as follows:—The British barque Tinto had arrived at the Falklands, with her cargo on fire, and after discharging about 100 tons, it was found necessary to scuttle her. The British barque Silvan, from Swansea for Valparaiso, was repairing damages sustained off Cape Horn. Her cargo had heated. The N. A. barque Andrew Jackson, from Callao for Cork, had completed her repairs, and was ready for sea. The British barque Edon, from Libertad for Falmonth, had put in leaky, and was discharging to repair. The Swedish barque Brava, from Parnaguá for Valparaiso, put in to repair rudder, and sailed again on October 9th.

"Carrizal Bajo.—In port, October 31st, barque Coronel, loading Corpor Regulus for Swansea; do Isabel Sir, discharging lumber; do Phillip Nelson, discharging coals; do Scottish Maid do; do Amalia, loading Corpor Regulus for Guayaquil. "Average business has been done in Exports during the past fortnight, but owing to the receipt of less favourable news from Europe, and an advance being made in Exchange, market closes very quiet.

"Wheat.—A brisk demand has taken place for this grain, and we advise the following sales:—25,000 hectolitres at \$3.60 c. b. in bulk, Penco; 21,800 at \$4.12 1/2 c. b. S. N.
