SOUTH AMERICAN CLUB. GENERAL MEETING AND INAUGURAL DINNER.

(From our own Correspondent.) London, Nov. 6th.

The fifth of November is henceforward a festival in the calendar of S. America. The Club which was fairly inaugurated last evening is not merely a convenience for business purposes or social relaxations; it is the important link which was wanting to make the connection between Europe and South America more intimate. The two extremes of the chain are the snowy peaks of the Cordilleras, pink, very pink with the sunrise or sunset, the lurid volcano, the dark, leaf-hidden river, the peering alligators' heads in picture-books of our fathers' histories; and on the other hand the duller realities of dry-goods and still drier merchants some of us can recall among the reminiscences of our manhood. The true want of this ubiquitous and cosmopolitan generation now growing up is the means of knowing all men and all places as they are, and without the history of the poet and artist, the retouching of the traveller, or the one-sided conception of the mere man of business. Any of us who have travelled beyond the limits of our village learn betimes that, whatever be the variety in the natural or artificial surroundings, the distinctions between men are exceedingly slight. The gossip of the Pampa Indian's bivouac is the fac simile of the gossip of a London Club or boudoir. Yet it is, after all, not so much the 'touch of nature' as the shape of the hat which induces us to recognise our common kindred. The English squire and Highland laird are undistinguishable one from the other. There was, perhaps, a little more difference between the Saxon hind and the bare-legged ruffian who were their respective progenitors. It will be the grand mission of the South American Club to assimilate costumes and customs, and prepare the way for the millennium which mechanical science has initiated. Even now a trip to South America need not be announced with fearful countenances, or preceded by presents of an armory of weapons of defence. It is beginning to be understood in this country that the streets of Buenos Ayres do not much differ from the Strand, or Windmill-street, except, perhaps, that in the former the nocturnal obstructions are not so demonstrative, and there is less danger of being 'run in' by the police. 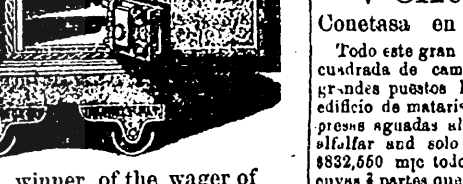

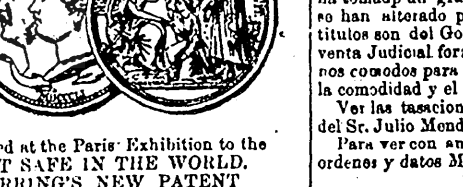
