Against this enormous deficit in available supplies, we have, perhaps, as before said, an increase of 15,000,000 lbs. in our own stocks, when the cost of any wool delivered from Europe is about 20 per cent higher than our own quotations of the three months last preceding, and when such wools are adapted to the American market have advanced in consequence of great scarcity at the October London sales of Colonial wools, and when no other markets are open to immediate orders...

and especially so for good class wools, which are very scarce this season. Purchases made have been chiefly for Antwerp and Havre, some having been taken for England, but nothing for the United States.

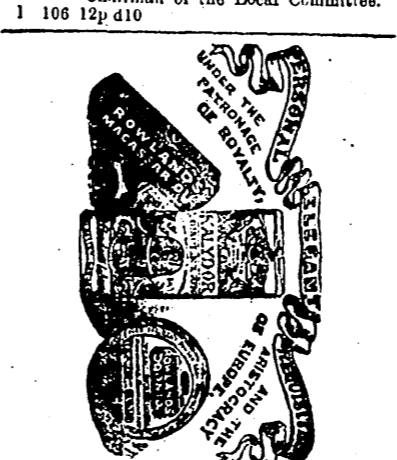
