President Grant in his message to Congress speaks in the most friendly

manuer of Spain. As regards the Virginius he says she was captured on the high seas, while carrying the American flag; the subject was a grave one, causing a lively impression on the public mind. It is established by treaties no vessel carrying the American flag can be overhauled or molested on the high seas, without an offence to the United States. Hence the proper reclamations were made of Spain, and that Government admitted the justice of same, the matter being now in a fair way for an arrangement satisfactory to both countries.

The American Government pointed out to Spain that slavery is the chief cause of the lamentable situation of Cuba, and that no peace or prosperity could ensue until its abolition. The seizure of the Virginius and

execution of the prisoners induce the Government to call out the whole American navy, pending negotiations.

Meantime Spain deserves some praise for having proclaimed a Republican form of Government, also for having abolished slavery in Porto Rico and promised to do so in Cuba.

The Secretary of the Navy at Washington has published his report on the various vessels, shewing that the whole fleet of the U. States is now ready to put to sea and commence active operations.

We are happy in being able to announce that Cholera matters improved sensibly yesterday. There were fewer cases, fewer deaths and less alarm. That physcological curiosity the Public Mind was more tranquil, and things generally looked better, Nevertheless, the exodus of the well to do classes from the city continues, and house rent in the suburbs took a bound upwards on Wednesday and Thursday, particularly in the direction of Flores, where \$5,000 mgc. per month was paid for a shanty that would be dear at \$1,000 mic. in more healthy times. Every one seems to think that the epidemic is mild, and will continue so. Up to the present the ratio of the deaths to the cases is very small indeed. On Thursday rumour mentioned the names of some leading men as having fallen victims to the epidemic, but all such reports happily proved untrue.

The latest official returns up to 2 o'clock p.m. yesterday give only EIGHT deaths from cholera in the previous 24 hours. In the San Roque Lazzaretto out of 51 patients only five have died. It will be seen that the epidemic has sensibly decreased.




