diplomatically. ARGENTINE ENTERPRISES.

The last advices from England were more encouraging as regards the numerous new enterprises connected with this country which the promoters are trying to launch on the London market. For the past ten years we had enjoyed unparalleled prosperity in everything relating to Government loans or joint-stock undertakings effected through English capital, when suddenly a check occurred that seemed to indicate a decline of public confidence in the magic name of Buenos

Ayres. The monetary crisis in England with a high bank rate, was a most inopportune moment for any new enterprises, and we cannot be surprised that English capitalists looked with coldness on Commissioner Aguirre's Ayres improvements, which might for looking after the stock, and 6 for projected loan for the City of Buenos have been successfully launched six months before. At the same time our credit was more or less injured by a host of concessionaires, some small, some large, and in a tew cases directly opposed to each other; the projectors going about from one house to another in London trying to dispose of their

concession by depreciating that of their rivals. The farm implements will include 4 Brabant, 3 Howard and 3 other ploughs, 3 cultivators, 7 harrows, and a number of threshers, winnowers, horse-carts, corn-shellers, rakes, churns, cheese presses, wheel-

barrows, saws, axes and garden tools. The expenditure will necessarily be heavy at the outset, the only return being a precarious income from fire-

wood, vegetables, butter, poultry, &c. The staff, besides Mr. Vial, will consist of 2 masters, 3 gardeners, a cook, the tillage, in all 19 persons. The idea suggests itself that, instead of 25 pupils, the Government ought to raise the number to 100, as the expense would not be much increased, while the usefulness of the institution would be quadrupled. At any rate we welcome the Model-farm as a step in the right direction, and hope the Government will see that the boys get religious instruction once a week; by all means teach them farming, but don't forget to teach them also the Ten Com-


