MAGELLAN COAL-FIELDS.

The latest advices from Sandy Point shew renewed activity in the coal-fields stead of throwing oil upon the troubled adjacent to that settlement, and the following letter throws so much light upon the subject that it will be read with some degree of interest.

> Santiago, January 1st. "Hitherto the only ambition of the Magellau Coal Co. has been to supply passing steamers, but now they have hopes of opening up markets at Buenos Ayres and Montevideo to supply the various gas companies. I spent month recently at the coal-fields and had occasion to see the abundance near the surface, fully 500,000 tons.


