Finally, the Bank undertakes and executes all legitimate transactions, within the orbit of banking operations.

receipts, the amounts to be remitted show no falling off; when the is nothing much doing in anything else, there is always demand for exchange, and we should bear in mind that for the last six months the Nat. Minister of Hacienda having funds in London has not remitted to pay the coupons and amortization. It is doubtful whether this arrangement, but it is "unsound," we are taking from the proceeds of a loan to pay the interest and amortization. The National Government has been very cautious in adopting the same plan, and ordered Messrs. Baring to pay from the new loan the interest coupons due on the Dominguez loan. This is all very well as long as it lasts, but the country must be prepared for its obligations; the present arrangement is temporary and before the end of the year the market here will have to meet the required remittances. It does seem as if the liabilities of the country are growing even faster than the country itself, and the only possible way to check this is to reduce our imports, which is next to impossible, owing to the extravagance of the people, the high rates of wages, and the increasing wealth of the population. During the week there have been two small failures, which is nothing at all for the market. Mr. Wright, the last few days has been taken up fully on Cedula and on National Bank shares. We note the firm shares as hypothesized securities are coming greatly on the market, and this it is supposed indicates a probability of a further call being made on the shares. During the week Messrs. Lams & Co. have effected another financial triumph, in successfully launching the new Joint Stock German Hotel Company, which has been contracted for with the builder, and will be at once begun. In a health point of view the week closes well, and the great arm of January has entirely subsided.

The Port next week; this would be a light overhanging, and there is really no sound cause for any further quarantine restrictions. The oldest merchants in the Plate state that they never before recollect business so dull in the month of January. During the week there has not been a single sale of salted hides; and, in fact, as far as we can learn, the hides are not to be had. The saladero "fiesta" this year will assuredly show a great falling off, as even up to the rivers the business at the saladeros is checked by the poor condition of the cattle, and the very high prices still asked. The only brisk business going on in the Plate is railway making. We hear of ships after ships entering with railway material. A leading shipbroker has requested us to offer some remarks on the danger of shipping maize. It seems the old maize is full of weevil and the new maize too fresh to ship. All the maize shipped from the States to Europe is first kindred a process unknown here, but which, it seems, must be introduced if a large business in the article is contemplated. The Leibnitz, we hear, takes 200 tons of wheat, and one or two vessels are loading maize. Doubtless the shippers understand their own business best; however, as the trade is new too much precaution cannot be adopted. The shipment of maize to Europe is really a most important feature of trade. There are few countries on the globe more adapted for the crop than the Plate. Hitherto the difficulty about this crop was always too great a supply. Maize rarely paid the farmer, for there was always too much of it at the season, and to deposit it involved expense and loss. Again the freight oftentimes overcame its market value; in fact, there was a hitch everywhere about the crop, save that the farmer has left a good profit, and the country is much indebted to the enterprise of Messrs. Wright, Kelso and Co. f. trial.

The German vessel, Viking, bound from Campana to Bahia, with hay, has put back from Colonia and entered this port, owing to the crew refusing to proceed with the voyage, declaring the vessel unseaworthy. She has been inspected, and it appears is worn out under her water mark. Quinta property is again coming into favour. Raitton and others were also sold. There was a large attendance of butchers, and for the whole of the show of sheep and cattle was the best held at this station.

It was stated on "Change to-day" that the applications for the new 1000s Ayr's loan in London barely covered the amount asked, and when the scrip was tried to be negotiated in the stock exchange it fell in one day one per cent. It is also however advised to remark that the new loan was never advertised in any of the London papers, and many parties who might have subscribed for the stock knew nothing of it until quoted at a premium.

A very important announcement has come down from Rosario to the effect that the B. and N. National Banks in the province will have no managers, the Bank will be managed by a board of 3 Directors and a Cashier; the arrangement seems an excellent one, and likely to economize much for the Bank.

The Municipality has voted the sum of 30,000 m/c to the Irish Sisters of Mercy; which the nuns have well earned, being ceaseless in their assistance to the poor people in their part of the town. Also the sum of \$14,000 for indemnity to Mr. Halterford for the change in the laws in the Plata regarding the nuns.

The receipts of the Custom house of Buenos Ayres for the month of January amounted to one million pats.
