ADVENTURE TO R.M.S. DOURO-

GALLANT CONDUCT OF OFFICERS AND MEN.

On Sunday morning the Douro left Montevideo for Flores Island to land passengers for quarantine previous to proceeding to B. Ayres. The weather was very rough, wind from sou-west. About 7 a.m. being anchored close to the island 2 boats were lowered, lite. boat and cutter, to pass to opposite imports, and 22 per cent in exports, side and land passengers. Owing to vizthe strong current they could not regain the ship, whereupon Captain Thwaites threw overboard a life-buoy attached to a strong line to enable theboats to haul back to the ship. One boat caught the line, but the other could not reach it, and was gradually drifting farther from the ship. The captain then lowered another boat with extra crew to go to the assistance of the farther off, but the wind increasing, with a heavy sea running, both boats were driven seaward till about 9 a.m. only the tops of their sails were faintly visible from the
