A private telegram of seven days later says Santa Cruz is a prisoner, and the revolt over.

BUENOS AYRES COAL.

Yesterday the new factory of Messrs. Flaesch and Co., in Calle Ayacucho, began working, and the samples of artificial coal it produces are of superior quality.

The industry is new among us, and of French origin, there being numerous factories of this kind in the vicinity of Paris and Lyons, for supplying artificial coal to establishments with large steam power or consumption of fuel.

Some ten years ago an attempt was made to introduce this combustible into the River Plate, and a consignment was sent to the Editors of this paper and sold to the Southern Railway.

The advantage it offers is its relative cheapness and greater calorific as compared with ordinary coal.

Mr. Flaesch, who is a Frenchman and has been several years in the country, is associated with some German gentlemen; the capital served for a long time in a similar factory in France.

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office, but its full execution of any course be beyond the powers of any one person.

Within a very few years we may reasonably expect from the systematic investigations already organized a mass of results which will thoroughly fulfill the most sanguine expectation of the friends of this institution, and both in their practical and scientific relations will justify the motives which prompted its establishment.

Meanwhile I venture to indulge a hope that the exertions of the band of observers already enlisted in the undertaking will have developed and stimulated new votaries of science, whose assistance will afford the means for extending the range of our inquiries, and in introducing new methods.

Among the methods which will hereafter be of high importance, when the number of stations shall have been essentially increased, and the general climate relations between the various regions shall have been determined, is that of following the progress of atmospheric changes by means of observations made not at the same local time, but at the same moment of absolute time in all places.

This procedure, employed with great success in the United States by the observers of the Army Signal-Corps, is the simplest and most practical for the purposes chiefly intended; but apart from other serious considerations, which must be taken into account in this country, it must necessarily be deferred until by extended series of observations made under the same local circumstances, we have acquired sufficient meteorological knowledge concerning the country to serve as a foundation upon which subsequent inquiries may be based.

To facilitate the correction of the barometer readings by allowing for the influence of temperature, as well as the determination of the relative atmospheric humidity and the tension of the atmospheric vapor from the readings of the wet and dry thermometers, I desired to obtain a supply of printed tables for distribution to observers.

With this view I applied to my honored friend, Prof. Henry, Secretary of the Smithsonian Institution, in Washington, asking his permission and assistance to enable us to have a small edition of these tables, reprinted from the collection published by Prof. Guyot under his direction.

With characteristic kindness and ready liberality, he immediately caused an edition of 250 copies to be printed, and sent as a gift from the Smithsonian Institution to the Argentine Meteorological Office. By an unfortunate misapprehension the tables thus prepared and sent are those applicable to the thermometer of Fahrenheit, and the barometer graduated to English inches, whereas all our barometers are graduated in the metric scale and the thermometer in centigrade divisions.

None the less however does this generous act of the Smithsonian Institution and its honored chief serve to excite our gratitude, and to animate us by the sympathy which it makes manifest.

To Dr. D. Santiago Caceres this institution is also indebted for the gifts of some valuable books.

To this brief statement of the policy and plans which appear most desirable, and of the progress, necessarily small as yet, which has been made in their execution, I will allow myself to add a few of the most interesting results, especially for Cordoba.

Our series of observations here began Sept. 1st 1872, and gives the following mean temperatures in the centigrade scale; the values for the five months September to January, being deduced from the experience of two years, the others from the last year alone.

Every new industry is again for B. Ayres, and the present deserves every encouragement.

ARGENTINE METEOROLOGICAL OFFICE

REPORT OF THE DIRECTOR FOR 1873 (Concluded.)

The important and interesting series of observations carried on for so many years by Messrs. Manuel Egua in Buenos Ayres, Felipe Caronti in Bahia Blanca, and Franklin Villanueva in Mendoza, have been placed at our disposal by those gentlemen with the utmost cordiality.

Authorized copies of these have been prepared, and from their study I anticipate results worthy of the disinterested devotion which prompted them. Some progress has indeed been already made in their discussion.

In addition to these data for former years, observations made during the year 1873, and more or less comprehensive according to the instruments available for the purpose, have been received from the following coadjutors, to whom cordial thanks are due—

These observations are immediately on their reception submitted to careful examination; those which have not been reduced by their authors are reduced at the earliest moment, and all the available time remaining is given to the task of deducing the mean values. This labor has thus far entirely devolved upon the Secretary of the

fall at the Observatory during the year 1873 was found to be 829mm.7, the gauge being 10c.5 above the level of the threshold of the main entrance.

Less than one-fifth of this amount fell during the six winter months, April to September, and nearly five-eighths of the total quantity during the three summer months, December to February.

To determine the difference between the amount of rain at the Observatory and at the city in the valley below, the secretary, Mr. Correas, has kept a record at his residence. The gauge used by him is of Babinet's form, perfectly similar to the one at the Observatory, and was, of course, verified in advance with much care. It is raised 3m.515 above the surface of the ground, and is about 36m.6 below the one at the Observatory, from which it is distant about an English mile.

During the period since the comparisons were begun, 459.1 millimeters of rain were registered at the Observatory and 496.3 in the city, the excess at the lower station being about 8 per cent.

During a few weeks the rainfall has also been measured by a gauge upon the roof of one of the houses attached to the Observatory, at a point 4.02 meters higher than the standard instrument. Here the amount of rain has been found by Mr. Bachmann to be 137.4 millimeters while that received by the other gauge was 150 mm.; the difference here also being about 8 per cent in favor of the lower instrument.

Another subject to which attention has been given is the intensity of the solar radiation, as determined by observations with a thermometer having a blackened bulb, and inclosed in a vacuum. The instrument employed was of the construction of Negretti and Zambra, being a maximum thermometer made upon their well-known principle, and carefully verified. After taking all precautions to insure trustworthy results, and to guard against any notion of the mercurial column in consequence of its own gravity, the temperature shown by this thermometer has on six different occasions during the present summer been as high as 72° c. On the 19th of February this thermometer rose to 73° or to less than 4° below the boiling point of alcohol.

For Bahia Blanca, the observations of Mr. Caronti during the past year give as the mean height of the barometer at

and fourteen years' experience give 1690 as the mean temperature, the observed extremes 37°2 and -2°7.

The close agreement in the temperatures found for Cordoba and Bahia Blanca, both as regards their mean value and their extreme range, will not fail to attract attention. It would appear that the superior elevation of Cordoba, corresponding to a difference of 36.09 mm. of barometric pressure, together with the possible influence of the neighboring Sierra, almost exactly counterbalances the effect of the difference of 7° 19' in the geographical latitude.

The average quantity of rain, deduced from 13 years of Mr. Caronti's observations, is 413 mm.; the amount in spring and autumn being in excess, and that during the winter being in defect; but there is no such marked inequality in its distribution among the several months as I have recorded for Cordoba.

In Buenos Ayres the long continued observations of Mr. Egua are undergoing a careful discussion. The results for the years which have thus far been computed indicate as the mean atmospheric pressure:
