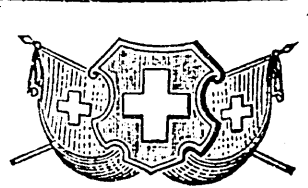

LOZANO'S HISTORY OF PARAGUAY AND LA PLATA. (Edited by Don Andres Lamas.) The editor of this work is one of the best Argentine scholars living...

Madrid, September 16th, 1897, entered a Jesuit college at the age of 14, received priest's orders August 15th, 1730. He had a brother who was the best Hebrew and Arabic scholar in Spain.

Lozano was only 20 years of age when he arrived in the River Plate, and some time later we find him teaching Philosophy in the University of Cordoba.

His first work was a Description of the Misiones de Paraguay in 1747. The latter was published in Madrid, 1600 pages folio, in 1754. His third and greatest work is that which Mr. Lamas is now publishing for the first time, the manuscript forming two volumes, respectively 1230 and 1468 pages: there are but two copies extant, viz., that of Mr. Lamas, and another, in the possession of Mr. Gregory Beeche, Argentine Consul-General in Chile.

Lozano was an indefatigable and daring traveller. He explored the Chaco and upper parts of Tucuman, visited Paraguay, Misiones and Corrientes, descended in a canoe from Tres Bocas to Las Conchas (Buenos Ayres), went up the Uruguay and came down the great falls again in a canoe, collected petrifications from the Cuareim to the Rio Negro, examined the archives of Buenos Ayres, wrote a description of the improvements in this city, crossed the Pampas, ascended the Andes, and returned to Cordoba by way of Tucuman and Salta, examining the archives in each place.

De Angelis in his collection of rare and unpublished manuscripts which appeared at B. Ayres in 1853 makes frequent mention of Lozano, especially as regarded his letter on the pretended settlement of Los Cesares or enchanted city supposed to be somewhere between Valdivia and the Straits of Magellan.

We have not space to give even a cursory glance at the great work before us, a volume of 600 pages, but as we open it here and there at hazard there are many things full of interest, showing how entertaining it must be to all who have time for wandering in these pleasant fields of literature.

As regards the present question with Chile we find Padre Lozano states that Paraguay extends nearly to the Straits of Magellan and comprises 3 great provinces: 1. Paraguay proper, comprehending Asuncion, Villa Rica, Curuguati, and Guarnipitan.

2. Tucuman, comprehending Tucuman, Cordoba, Rioja, Santiago, Salta, Jujuy and Catamarca. 3. Rio de La Plata, including Corrientes, Santa Fe, Montevideo, Buenos Ayres, and the southern lands that extend towards the famous Straits of Magellan.

His description of the Salta de Guayra, on the Upper Parana, is very graphic, and he adds that the place is infested with monstrous fish very like sharks, that two men can hardly lift one, some being as big as an ox, and swimming with their backs above water. One of them was known to snatch up an Indian, swallow him, and then throw up the lifeless body whole on the bank.

The river Paragua, which gives name to that country, signifies in the Indian tongue 'the stream of the feathery crown.' The other rivers are also described at great length, as well as the Jesuit Missions. We read that Governor Cabrera's expedition in 1622, in quest of the enchanted city of the Cesars, was arduous and expensive, the Governor and his party returning after many hardships to Tucuman.

Lozano gives a bad account of the early Spanish settlers, whose corrupt lives were a stumbling-block to the Jesuits in their efforts to civilise the natives. Mr. Lamas has been unable to ascertain whether Lozano died here or returned to Europe. Nothing is heard of him after 1750, when his last work was written at Cordoba.

At the time of the expulsion of the Jesuits in 1767, the names of the more notable fathers shipped by the Viceroy Bucarelli were: Guavara of Toledo, Falconer of Manchester (aged 66) and Dobrizhoter of Styria. Let us hope, says the present distinguished and patriotic editor, that history may yet discover the spot where is contained the dust of the best and most reliable writer on the early age of Paraguay and La Plata.

The latest news from Rio about the Platino cable is, that the Ambassador only said about the end of February, and that we need not look for telegrams from Rio before June.

These were the results in every quarter on Sunday, but the results were not to say favourable, some few sites on the Flores head, facing the railway, and opposite to Rodriguez's celebrated house, were sold at the rate of \$2,800 m/c per vara front; the lots facing the Flores Road were not sold, and the auction stopped.

Another small house, in bad repair, \$12,000 m/c; Mr. Iturrida, buyer. The steamer Tayapuru will be up in the morning from Montevideo with the Aconcagua's mails and passengers. It was said on 'Change' that although no decree is published, vessels from Montevideo will be allowed to enter from tomorrow morning and free of quarantine.
