

The occasion is a most auspicious one. It celebrates a new era in the history of mankind, for previous to 1776 there was no civil or religious iberty, no education for the working classes, no democracy of intellect, no Land of Promise for the industrious emigrant, no comity of nations making a man above all a Citizen of the World. The principles for which Washington fought, and with the blessing of Heaven conquered, were so salutary that upon such basis we see to-day a nation of 40 millions of enlightened citizens, whose patrimony extends from the Atlantic to the Pacific, whose achieve nents are marked in all the improved appliances of industry, and whose maerial progress exceeds that of all Euope collectively.

The Americans have invited us to take part in their Exhibition, and President Sarmiento has accepted the invitation, at the same time appointing Messrs. Oldendorff, Olivera, Leguizamon, La Fuente, Palacios and Newton as Commissioners for the purpose.

The Exhibition will open at Fairmount Park, Philadelphia, on April 19th, and close on October 19th, 1876. Applications for space must be made before March 4th; 1875, and all articles for Exhibition arrive at Philadel phia by January 1st, 1876.

The Argentine Committee, under Mr. Oldendorff, held its first meeting last December, and appointed subcommittees for the various Provinces, that of Buenos Ayres consisting of Messrs. Pereyra, Jurado and Dupor tal. A circular to the Governors of Provinces was issued in January, inviting them to shew their zeal and patriotism by getting together the most valuable products to swell the Argentine stall at Philadelphia, and attract

the notice of all comers. At the Paris Exhibition of 1867 there were only 6 Argentine Provinces represented, namely Buenos Ayres, other questions to decide in Europe Cordoba, Mendoza, San Juan, Tucuman and Jujuy. Nevertheless this Republic took twice as many prizes as all the other Spanish Republics in the aggregate. Indeed the wonder is, that with such rich products at our command we do not take more pains to shew them. Even Montevideo made some figure last year at Vienna, and
