income tax, and they now propose to pay a further dividend of 10s per share, less income tax (making a total distribution of 1 1/2 per cent for the year 1873), and to carry £200,000 to reserve fund, thus leaving a balance of £371,862 to be carried forward.

The matters in dispute between the Company and Mr. Billinghurst have now been so far arranged that the revenue retained by him, amounting to £4,327 19s. 7d., has been recovered, and an order has been obtained from him to his representative at Buenos Ayres to deliver to the Local Board all the property belonging to the Company. It will thus be seen that although a transfer to the Company was effected on the 1st January, 1872, Mr. Billinghurst, notwithstanding all the efforts of the Board, has virtually remained in possession of the whole of the property of the Company in Buenos Ayres, and further he has contended that the exclusive management of the Company belonged by right to him. The order referred to was forwarded to the local Board on the 22nd January, and the Directors have already heard that steps were being taken towards its execution, and they hope that by this date the premises and rolling stock of the Company have been transferred, and placed under the direction of an efficient manager, who has been appointed by the local board.

Mr. Billinghurst having sold his shares in the Company, and being no longer a registered shareholder, as prescribed by clause 137 of the articles of association, the directors have intimated to him that they do not require him to resume his seat at the local board on his return to Buenos Ayres. The directors regret that they are unable to submit a report on the condition of the permanent way, premises, and rolling stock of the Company. The managing directors advise having been informed by Mr. Billinghurst's representative, that this had been forwarded to London, but it has not yet been received by the board. Orders have, however, been sent to the local board to furnish a full report, so soon as they are in complete possession of the Company's property.

The local board has also been instructed to renew the negotiations for mutual running powers with other Tramway Companies, which were suspended last year in consequence of the position assumed by Mr. Billinghurst. It is these negotiations as the board anticipates, an increase of rolling stock will be required.

The buildings and property of the Company are now fully insured against fire.

The Directors have pleasure in stating that a Municipal decree has at last been passed, allowing trumpeters to be dispensed with, and from 1st October this has been availed of. Under the regulations of that decree the Company has had to deposit in the Provincial Bank of Buenos Ayres a sum equivalent to £800, as a guarantee fund against injuries that may be caused to persons by accident or by the negligence of the drivers or conductors. The salaries of two Municipal Inspectors which amount to £400 per annum have also to be borne by the Company, but, notwithstanding this heavy impost, there will be a considerable saving in the expenditure by the change.

Mr. F.W. Moore has been appointed one of the Managing Directors in Buenos Ayres, vice Mr. J.B. Wanklyn, whose resignation was reported at the last meeting.

The Directors regret to announce the death of their valued colleague, Mr. James Reynolds, but being of opinion that the number of Directors may with advantage be reduced, they do not recommend the election of anyone to the seat at the Board thus become vacant.

The two Directors now retiring are Lord Alfred Paget and Mr. Alfred James Lambert, who, being eligible, offer themselves for re-election.

The auditors, Mr. W. J. Rhodes and Mr. Luke Bishop, retire at the General Meeting, but offer themselves for re-election.

ON CHANGE

June 1st, 1874. Ounces—400, Sols—123, Nat. Bonds—75, Cedulas—81

The stock market opened rather better to-day, and Cedulas improved somewhat. In the early part of the day Cedulas ruled very weak, but in the afternoon one of our leading native brokers entered as a buyer, took up on time fully 100,000 and seemed well disposed to buy many more.

The Provincial Bank to-day did but a small business; the discounts reached 6 1/2 millions, only 12 1/2 millions asked. Money in the open market rules very tight, and the brokers complained of a rather dull day. 40,000 pata. were offered in the Bolsa on Cedulas at 12 per cent., but only 10 would be paid; stock valued at 75.

The news from the camp is simply disastrous, we heard on 'Change to-day that passengers for Dolores had to walk from the Salado, the diligences having stopped; no horses, not even bullock carts; whilst up in the North there are several instances where the money is as low as 15,000 heads; an English gentleman just up from the South, says that all over the ground he shot he met at every turn dead animals.

It was announced on 'Change to-day that application has been made to the Brazilian Government for a steamer to lay the Platino cable. The gold in the B'ia has come to the Maua Bank, this Bank has now imported since the run on Navia's Bank the following—

In April per Liverpool steamer £160,000, In May per German do. 75,000, In June per do. 5,000

Total in gold—£225,000

The sales to-day were—Cedulas—16,800 80 1/2, For end month—145,000 80 1/2, National Bank—100 shares cash, at 90.

In the liquid tin there was a heavy business done, and the brokers were most anxious to know what was up, as one party bought much more than we attribute the move to the new project before the Chambers. Sales—For cash—8,000 81, End of month—50,000 81 1/2, Deliverable—20,000 80 1/2, For cash—6,000 81 1/2 with right to 5,000 more at end of month, For end of month—20,000 81

Market closed buyers 81 cash and end of month. In exchange something done on Montevideo at 1/2, nothing more.

In the South market to-day dry hides depositing: 5 carts lambs wool from Alaga estancia at 66, about 23 carts in market for to-morrow. The B'ia will be up on the 4th inst.

Coal 2 cargoes sold at 15 pats. In the Ounce 3,000 ar. wool sold at from 75 to 80. Mr. F. Hahn, former partner of the leading firm of Fisher, Hahn & Co., leaves to-night for Montevideo for West Coast.

The sale at Floresta yesterday was very good, the land sold at high prices, and realized 1 1/2 millions good for Floresta.

At a late hour Cedulas ran up to 8 1/2 for end of month, buyers. The news is that the Mortgage Bank is about to apply to the Provincial for a loan on the new bank building. Rather a strange negotiation.

Respecting the shipments of wool up to end of May '74, about which there is so much said, a leading foreign exporter has favored us with his figures—

Actual shipments from this port from Oct. 1st 1873 to 31st May 1874—165,000, Engaged—9,000, Stock, more or less—10,000, To arrive from camp—8,000, 192,000

Total wool shipments from this port for clip 1872-73, 1,927,740 bales.

The Montevideo Government, we read, has signed no less than 17 railway contracts; that is to say—six connected with the central Uruguay, four with Nueva Palmita, two to Pando, Minas Maldonado, San Carlos and Rocha, one from Maldonado to Abollari and Laguna Mare, one to Marones and Pando and the other from Salto to St. Rosa. This is a very long list for the B. Oriental, and shows the great railway enterprise going on in that country.

The new public land law, before the chambers of Montevideo, will rescind all donations of land by former governments to soldiers and politicians of either the Blanco or Colorado party, and the present occupiers of all such lands will have three months to denounce the lands and send in their claims. A land committee will be formed to carry out the provisions of the law, they can sell estates of no greater extent than four square leagues at the rate of eight thousand patacons per league, half cash and half in twenty-four months. The same committee can rent the public lands in estancias of six square leagues or under for a term of five years, at the rate of two hundred patacons a square league.

The present holders of all such lands always having the preference, and all the proceeds arising from said lands to be sent to London for account of the new loan.

It will interest ship brokers and shippers in general to know that the Montevideo Government under the pretext of helping the mariner is about to create a new tax on all ultramar vessels entering Oriental ports. The new tax will be two cents a ton, and the funds so raised are to be applied towards the salvage and assistance of vessels wrecked on the coast. The Government to conclude a contract with the new salvage company stated by the marine captain, Lunus Dezan, which company will supply the captain of the port with four steam life boats of a hundred and fifty tons each. These life boats are to be constructed that in case of war they will serve as gunboats, and will carry in their stern circular guns which, we suppose, will fire round about. One of these steam life boats to make a trip once a week to Maldonado and back, the others to remain in port. No salvage is to be charged for saving passengers or their luggage, and the company is to run a line of telegraph out to Maldonado and to the different light ships at the mouth of the river. We suppose the laws will be passed next week, would any shipbroker or merchant please supply us with a list of the light charges and port dues here and in Montevideo.

The new Montevideo emission law for five millions of patacons is now before the Chambers, and we suppose will also be passed. The notes will be issued for two-thirds Deuda Interna and one-third gold. In the Custom House and Government offices only the new notes or gold will be taken. This new law will have the double benefit of helping the Deuda Interna people, and also supplying the market with a new circulating medium.

It will interest exchange brokers and merchants to know the exact amount of exchange taken by the National Government during the months of March and April. The Bulletin publishes as follows—

The monthly balance of the Mortgage Bank was out to-day, and will be found at foot hereof. The figures are important when compared with the previous months—

Cedulas in circulation, Series A: Dec. 31st, 1873, 10,813,700, Jan. 31, 1874, 10,843,900, Feb. 29 do, 11,120,800, March 31 do, 11,370,000, April 30 do, 11,662,000, May 31 do, 12,037,100

The issue of the other series shows no change, save a slight diminution due to the amortization.

The issue of Cedulas during the month averages about half a million, but this we believe is a large amount that does not go on the market. The amount of mortgage redemptions paid during the month for Series A shows no change, but the amortization of course shows a good and healthy increase.

In our leading columns we'll be found two very important articles for merchants &c.: one Mr. Babin's excellent report on the Mortgage Bank of which he is president, and the other the official report of the negotiation of the Santa Fe loan; about the latter business there seems to be much ill-feeling in Santa Fe, and we read that a law is about to be passed to the National Bank here complains that they refused to allow him to occupy the bank p'ids to seal up the boxes and what not and exhausted counting so much gold, he asked for a glass of water it was also refused, these particulars are more amusing than important.

The month and week have opened well. The first news in this morning was a telegram to the STANDARD announcing the entry of the B'ia with fifty thousand pounds sterling in gold, and the saving of the cable from Chay to Rio Grande. People were anxious to know to whom the gold came, but our telegram said nothing, and it was generally supposed to be the Maua Bank. This with the 275,000 the same bank received, makes in all 125,000 sterling fresh gold received in the Plata during the last few days.

There was a most painful anxiety in town all day yesterday about the contents of the much respected Mr. Mauro Matti. We are happy to say that at an early hour this morning one of the balls was extracted, and the unfortunate gentleman pronounced out of danger. Mr. Matti is a broker much esteemed in commercial circles.
