The Neva entered this morning, but the mails came ashore late owing to the usual port delays. We received from Montevideo the Times of the 9th May, being one day later than brought by Lusitania; the London money market presents no change, Cansel had recovered from their slight fall caused by Lord Russell's speech in the House on the political state of Europe.

This was a difficult Saturday enough, and everyone complained of the tightness of money. It is most significantly strange that in the dull winter season, money should be tight at it in the summer season when business was at its height.

There was, of course, no insurance on the Gasoleno depot which was burnt down on last Thursday, such merchandise being uninsured. We note, however, that people in Buenos Ayres are gradually beginning to insure their dwellings, and most of the English companies with agents here are doing a good business.

Application has been made to the Provincial Government by the English estateeers of sauce Grando for title in fee to their lands down there, and, indeed, these hardy pioneers deserve it. The first day of our sales was very bad. Buyers did not know what to pay, and consequently prices ruled very irregular, certainly as low as last February prices, if not lower in some instances.

In London the sales have turned out very unprofitable, and buyers have taken alarm at the heavy quantities brought forward and to bring forward later in the year. Messrs. Windolfer and Boves of London write the following:—'It is estimated, there will be an increase of from 50,000 to 70,000 bales this year in the Australian and New Zealand clips above 1873.
