TEATRO DE LA OPERA.

The 'empresario' of the above theatre has certainly evinced a very enterprising and plucky spirit in placing on the boards so early in the season two such operas as 'La Favorita' and 'Un Ballo in Maschera.' These are great favorites with the Buenos Ayrean musical public, who moreover have not yet lost the impressions left on their minds by Pozzoni and Cortesi last winter in their almost perfect impersonation of the two respective leading parts. And yet no very great disap-

pointment has been expressed at the efforts made in these two well known operas by the new company; on the contrary, the 'Ballo' in particular was well received on Sunday night. In 'La Favorita' on Saturday we thought the cast, always excepting Madame Stella Bonheur and Sr. Perotti, a poor one, and the dresses and singing of the chorus were on a par, both being devoid of brilliant or shining characteristics.

Madame Stella Bonheur appears to be, and very deservedly so, a great favorite with the audience. She possesses a powerful and well tutored voice, and if she lacks some of the depth and fullness of tone of Madame Biancolini's lower notes, she certainly surpasses her in the easy and artistic transition from deep contralto enunciation to mezzo soprano vocalization. Her acting, also, is very powerful and graceful.

Sr. Julio Perotti very carefully sang through his 'role,' and in get-up and bearing was an excellent personification of the part.

On Sunday evening the artists were favored with a crowded and fashionable audience to witness their efforts in 'Un Ballo in Maschera.' We were glad to find that the dresses of the chorus were more elegant and appropriate, and their singing much more studied and harmonious.

Our little favorite, the page, was represented by Madame Angelita de Alberti. This winning little artist, although possessing a somewhat small voice, sang the sprightly music of her part very sweetly, throwing into her acting just sufficient graceful pertness to render her as a page irresistible.

Mme. Adeli Montoldi, as Amelia, evinced great power of voice and perfect vocalization, but we fancied sometimes that her notes struck somewhat harshly on the ear, and lacked more sweetness. She acted the difficult and distressing part of a wife accused of infidelity with great histrionic power and grace.

Signor Julio Perotti again looked well, and sang splendidly as Ricardo. In the opening scene, Sr. Felipe Bettini made a favourable impression as Renato; and in the fourth scene he was rapturously eulogized in his solo. He has a fine, well modulated voice, and acts in a finished, quiet graceful manner.

Madame Stella Bonheur again was greatly applauded as Ulrica, the prophetess, and her rendering of the part of the mystic exponent of the dark future was simply perfect. In the scene which represented her own dark abode she both sang and acted splendidly, and the 'tout ensemble' after the entrance of the mariners in their appropriate costumes, was very striking. The last scene, representing the Count and Secretary, all worked hard and well in securing the success of the 'Ballo.' To-night the empresario promises us Lucia de Lammermoor, and we have no doubt it will be done. We trust, however, the so-called Scotch dances will be carefully rehearsed.
