The Bolivia Mails.

IMPORTANT FROM ENGLAND.
London papers of the 15th give a full description of the arrival of the Czar and his reception by the Queen at Windsor Castle. His Majesty was loudly cheered along the route, being attended by a suite of 80 Russian nobles.

The latest papers brought by the Bolivia contain the following items.
To save any dispute about precedence among the daughters of the Queen during the visit of the Czar, it has been arranged that the Duchess of Edinburgh shall, as a rule, walk behind her father when the Royal party appear together in public. A strange story is current to the effect that the announcement in yesterday's Times about her Royal Highness was made by the Czar himself.

Mr. Disraeli has no thought of retiring from the Premiership. Reports to that effect are unfounded.
In neither House of Parliament was there yesterday much that was worth notice. In the Upper House, the Earl of Carnarvon, made it plain that the Government does not intend to retire from the Gold Coast. It means, instead, to take up a permanent residence there, to re-arrange the boundaries of its territories, to change its headquarters, and to raise the salaries of its servants at a charge to the country of some £2,000 per annum. The Earl's explanations were well received by the House and by Earl Kimberley, so that the Gold Coast may be regarded as out of the way for the present. In the Lower House, proceedings were very dreary. Mr. Roebuck did his best to wake up his colleagues by discovering in a harmless motion of Mr. Dillwyn a lurking design against the House of Lords, and then the House fell into the hands of Mr. Whalley, who was getting well into the subject of his own wrongs and the wrongs of the Claimant when a count-out put an end to his labours.

Mr. Roebuck severely condemned the authorities in Ireland for having illegally kept a supposed Fenian in prison for the last 3 years without bringing him to trial. He said the English people would not tolerate such barbarity.

Count Capo d'Istria is appointed Russian special correspondent for the Goloa, during the Czar's stay in England.

The will of Captain Strode C.B., late commander of H.M.S. Pylades, was proved under £7,000.

An English gentleman named Crowther was robbed of all his luggage in crossing the Apennines, and writes in the Times of the 15th about it.

The Bill for Honschold Suffrage in Counties was opposed by Government and thrown out by 287 to 173 votes.

Marshal MacMahon, in a speech to the Cavalry School of Saumur, dilated upon the importance of cavalry in war, and stated that in the late war with Germany the French were sadly deficient in working this branch of the service.

The King of Holland, in reply to the loyal demonstration in connection with the celebration of the twenty-fifth anniversary of his accession to the throne, has expressed his satisfaction at finding himself at the head of a faithful and happy people. He adds that his efforts to protect their rights and to promote their welfare have been seconded by the national representatives, and rewarded by the attachment displayed by all to the cause of order, by the industrious spirit of the people, and their inalienable love for himself and his dynasty.

No settlement of the Ministerial difficulty in Spain has yet been reported. It is supposed the old device of a Coalition Cabinet will be tried, and that General Zabala will be entrusted with its formation. The Carlists are still carrying on a sort of guerilla war in Spain, and are attempting to occupy the passes leading to Bilbao.

The quarrelling and fighting between the rival Governors of Arkansas has been in some measure appeased by the support given by General Grant to the Republican Governor, Mr. Baxter. That gentleman has managed to assemble a quorum of the Legislature; and it has been proposed that both sides shall disband their forces and surrender the capital into the hands of the Washington authorities. The other Governor-elect, Mr. Brooks, has convened an extra Session of the Legislature to consider this matter.

An extraordinary rumour is current with regard to the Grand Duke Nicholas. It is reported that he has been deprived of the command of the expedition upon the Oxus, and has been placed under arrest.

An inquest was held at Ashby-de-la-Zouch, yesterday, on the bodies of Catherine Sergison, aged 19, and Agnes Emily Frazer Sergison, aged 17. It appeared that the deceased were nieces of Mr. Robertson, of Nethersea

Hall, and that they had come on a visit for the purpose of being present at the opening, after restoration, of Nethersea Church. About nine o'clock on Sunday evening, after dinner, the deceased and Mr. and Mrs. Robertson were in the drawing-room. As the younger of the deceased was passing the fireplace, her dress, which was of light material, caught fire. Her sister, who was similarly attired, rushed to her aid, and she too was enveloped in flames. Mrs. and Miss Robertson, in their endeavours to extinguish the flames also took fire. The four then ran wildly out of the room. Mrs. and Miss Robertson rushed into the dining-room, where the flames were soon put out by Mr. Robertson and some of his visitors. The Misses Sergison, who had run into the kitchen, were not so fortunate, and before the flames could be put out they were both most severely burned about the face, arms, and body. Dr. Edmunds and three other medical gentlemen were called, but the burns and the shock to the system were such that Miss Agnes Sergison expired at half-past eight o'clock on Monday morning, and her sister half an hour later. The Jury returned a verdict of accidental death through burning.
