English Theatricals.

The Variety Show at the Victoria Theatre on Friday night was attended by the largest and most respectable foreign audience that we remember for a long time.

There is abundant food for his humor in B. Ayres, and as his talent in this direction seems inexhaustible we may look for new songs every month.

There is nothing in his satire to offend any one among us, native or foreign, and here in lies much merit.

The performance of Friday was agreeably diversified by some English ballads by Mrs. Phillips (Miss Lowther) late of the Theatre Royal Holborn, and we are glad to be able to assure the public that her costume and dancing will be improved next time, so as to allow ladies to assist at a performance otherwise admirable and entertaining.

The pianoforte performances of Mr. Tinney are worthy of a pupil of Santley's, and his singing of the Mania reminds one of Henry Russell.

On the whole the Variety Show, as amended, promises to have a great run, and we wish Mr. Phillips the fullest success.

MONTEVIDEAN LETTER.

June 19th. The steamer Villa del Salto, Capt. John O Morse, sails this afternoon for your port and Salto; to this latter port she carries a large number of passengers consisting of ministers, Doctors at law, merchants and minors, who are all bound to that progressive city to inaugurate the opening of the first section of the Railway from there to Itapuy which is to take place on Monday next.

Of course you will send a correspondent from your office to report on this important event, and should he go in this steamer I am certain that he will meet with the greatest kindness and attention from her worthy Captain and the very efficient Commissaries Messrs. Baicgalupi and Saunders.

On board the steamer I hear that all the Silver Plate that has been hid in as deep a hole as the well that contains your seventy thousand ounces since she arrived out to this port will be displayed and made use of for the first time; unfortunately your correspondent cannot leave this to assist at this great feat, but trusts to have a glimpse at the much talked of table before the leaving of the steamer.

Again we find the pension list last year absorbed \$884,776, whereas the Government now proposes to wipe it out altogether by giving Colonels, Majors, widows &c. a sum of 7 millions in bonds bearing 6 per cent. interest and 1 per cent. amortization; this would be a yearly charge of \$490,000, and effect a saving of \$394,776 in favor of the revenue.

The present method of raising money by borrowing from the Banks is both impolitic and expensive. The sum of \$2,430,000 was borrowed from the German Bank and Señor Fraguero at 12 per cent, depositing Emprestito Extraordinario bonds at 90 in security, besides 5 commission and a charge of \$30,000 for travelling expenses of the Commissioners to London.

The collection of Contribucion Directa is most defective, the city of Montevideo producing almost as much as the 12 departments; viz:—

Montevideo..... 390,211

Departments..... 403,835

784,046

The collectors, altogether omitted 926 square leagues of land, as appears by their returns compared with ascertained area. The total property valuation shows 90 millions for the city, paying 4 per mil, and 88 for the camp, paying 44 per mil. The former enjoys some security, yet pays less than the latter.

The Contaduria recommends the appointment of official valuers with fixed salaries; and a statistical department, the want of the latter being keenly felt.

The Junta of Montevideo, like that of Buenos Ayres, is in hopeless bankruptcy, its debts accumulating from 1868 to the present. The gas bill has not been paid for three years, and now amounts to \$37,000 sterling, on which 12 per cent. interest is charged.

It is well to publish these facts honestly, so that English readers may see, that if the finances of the country are in great confusion the resources at the same time are sufficient under improved management to turn the balance in favor of income as against expenditure.

The consequence has been little business done, the sales were as follows—

In produce nothing whatever has been done to-day that I can report; this market may be said to be very calm.

A large speculating business is being done just now to the extent of one million of dollars by two firms, the end of the month will probably bring some fun to the market; the spec is in Denda Internas which are at present firm.

The steamer Fe, belonging to the Captain of the Port's section, left this to go to the wreck of the schooner Triunfo, that was wrecked a few days ago on the coast, all her crew being drowned.

BRITISH AND AMERICAN CLUB IN RIO DE JANEIRO.

This club held its third annual meeting for Athletic Sports on Thursday 4th instant, on the ground near Rua do General Polydoro, Botafogo.

The ground is conveniently reached by Tramways cars of the Botanical Gardens Co., which pass on one side of it, within a few minutes walk. Its situation is probably unsurpassed for natural beauty by any other place in the charming suburbs at Rio; the Corcovado, with towering peak, and the surrounding Hills forming it, as were it, into a grand amphitheatre.

Admission was obtained to view the sports by payment of 1\$, and another 1\$ admitted to the grand stand.

The weather was most delightful, though, perhaps, for a few hours, a little too warm for the Athletes; and the ground itself was in much better condition than at last year's meeting.

The sports commenced in the forenoon shortly after eleven o'clock; from which hour, throughout the day, the Grand Stand, capable of holding about 500 persons, was filled with the elite of the British and Foreign Residents, chiefly ladies, together with many Brazilian families of the upper class. British, American and Brazilian flags decorated the Stand, but, undoubtedly, its chief embellishment was the young and beautiful ladies occupying the seats, who were most tastefully and fashionably dressed in bright and charming colours.

There were a large number of spectators, many of whom moved hither and thither to witness closely the exciting contests of skill, strength, and endurance, in which they manifested the most hearty interest. Some backed, others encouraged their friends who competed, and others still did both: thus numerous sums of small amount changed hands, and not a few pairs of gloves as well were lost and won by the fair sex in the course of the day.

At intervals a German instrumental band increased the pleasure of the proceedings by discoursing sweet strains of music.

The programme commenced with a flat race of 100 yards, first prize silver cup; 2nd a locket. Although there were 23 entrants for this race, it was only contested by 7 of them, who all ran well. The winner of the first prize was R. Robinson, time 11 1/2 seconds, and the 2nd prize was gained by O. Collins.

Throwing the cricket ball—prize an opera-glass—was the next contest. In this case there were 9 competitors out of 13 entrants. The best throw, 82 yards, was made by F. Popham, who carried off the prize last year by a pitch of fully 103 yards.

Next followed a flat race of 220 yards, 1st prize a silver cup; 2nd gold studs. Out of 19 members entered for this race, only 6 answered the call to the field; and, after a smart run, R. Robinson came in first, time 23 seconds, followed next by H. A. Bell.

For the high jump which succeeded, prize a silver cup, S. Oliver had no competitor, although 11 members' names are on the programme for the jump. Having taken only one jump, 3 feet 11 inches high, Oliver may be said literally to have 'walked off' with the prize.

Cutting a ball of 14 lbs., prize a writing-desk, was left to 4 strong and brawny Scots out of 15 members named in the lists. W. R. McVinen gained the prize by a 'put' of 28 feet 9 inches, which however is 2 feet short of the best 'put' last year.

The first part of the programme ended with a flat race of one mile, first prize a silver cup; 2nd a silver cup. Only 5 members out of 17 entered, started for this, the longest race; the running was good as a whole, but J. O. Gunton, who ran round the course in excellent style, came in first, an easy winner, after 5 minutes 44 seconds, which is some seconds less than the time taken for the mile race in 1873. The second prize was won by W. R. D. Ginty.

There was now, very appropriately an interval of about half an hour for Lunch, the Band then playing several pieces of music.

After this was announced a flat race of half a mile, open to all comers, 1st prize a silver Cup; 2nd an Album, of 24 entrants only 4 ran in this race, which was well won by E. Moore in 2 minutes 32 seconds, the exact same time in which this race was run last year. Moore was next and closely followed to the goal by W. Bullard, recently arrived here, and who thus gained the Album.

Mr. Sandford has despatched to the Interior Mr. Glasgow as special agent to work up in the province. Messrs. Lanman and Kemp's business. We learn by the mail that one end of the Mens cable has been picked up and buoyed, and the steamers have now gone in search of the other end.

It appears that a new canal with 17 feet of water has been discovered at Eszenada; this is a most important affair and will save the expense of dredging the bar—we hear that the new canal is being buoyed. The Western Railway is now arranging to henceforth receive its coal and all heavy materials at the Punta Lara mole. The Hamburg steamer Montevideo arrived home at Hamburg all right, she suffered no quarantine, all on board well when she entered that port. Some River Plate men met Mr. Clausen in the streets of Hamburg looking first rate.

At the conclusion of the report we find the following remarks: "Your resident director at Buenos Ayres has on more than one occasion signified his desire to be relieved of his arduous duties, but we hope and believe that Mr. Armstrong would continue to act as your representative, and in order that his labor and responsibility may be diminished, we recommend that he should be requested to act as chairman of a local committee, to be nominated by him subject to the approval of the London board, as has been found to work advantageously in similar undertakings."

The shareholders have received a dividend since March, 1872 the sum standing to the credit of revenue for year ending 17th May 1873, including in the amount received from the Government on account of the guarantee will be sufficient for paying 212,767 lrs. for the half year's Debenture Interest, to pay a dividend of 61 per share, which requires a sum of 255,900 sterling, and as the Board has sufficient funds in hand for the purpose, the Board recommends that a dividend of 21 a share should be declared and paid.

The contract for printing the notes of the new Provincial Bank of Santa Fe has been given to the American Bank Note Company; two million notes ordered. Also the supply of cheques has been given to the same Co. Mr. Sandford has despatched to the Interior Mr. Glasgow as special agent to work up in the province. Messrs. Lanman and Kemp's business.

We learn by the mail that one end of the Mens cable has been picked up and buoyed, and the steamers have now gone in search of the other end. It appears that a new canal with 17 feet of water has been discovered at Eszenada; this is a most important affair and will save the expense of dredging the bar—we hear that the new canal is being buoyed. The Western Railway is now arranging to henceforth receive its coal and all heavy materials at the Punta Lara mole. The Western Railway wagons run alongside and from thence through out to Chilivoy and Lobos.

This Eszenada Railway promises yet to be one of the most important lines in the Plate. The Savio, Mr. Bonnemason's steamer, cleared to-day; she is a good sailor and will make the run home in her usual short time. She took a large mail and a full passenger list. The Hamburg steamer Montevideo arrived home at Hamburg all right, she suffered no quarantine, all on board well when she entered that port. Some River Plate men met Mr. Clausen in the streets of Hamburg looking first rate.

increased facilities and rapidly with which wool are brought from the interior of the River Plate to the ports and from there to our market. In former years wool used to come from the interior in carts drawn by oxen, arrivals were distributed over nine months and this wool shipped by sailing vessels arrived here in slow succession from December to November. To-day this has entirely changed. Railways into the interior are being constructed every year. Large parts of the clip is brought in a few days into the ports, where weeks and months had to be spent before. From thence steamers bring this wool in thirty days to Europe, when formerly as much as three months have been spent sometimes by slow Italian or Dutch sailing vessels.

"All these radical changes tend to throw heavy quantities of wool upon European markets during the first months of the year, and to leave us with comparatively small stocks during the second half, such as has been the course of things this year, and as we expect will be the course in 1876, perhaps even more so.

"Export may be lessened to a certain extent when holders, owing to unfavorable news, prefer to deposit their wools, but then, arrivals will accumulate, and the pressure will be felt all the same.

"It is really high time that the cable correspondence with the River Plate will be completed this summer, to have our intercourse more regulated in 1875, and that avoid as much as possible his year's inconvenience and even danger of having facilities for quick shipment of produce no longer in accordance with an antiquated mode of transmission of news.

"Sheepskins. The demand is very slack, and holders would have to submit to lower prices, to see business done. Stock about 950 bales. Hides. Little doing. In dry hides some transactions have taken place; mat. oxen 12 1/2-10th kos. selling at fca 148, good campos at fca 141. In mat. cows various lots were done at fca 165 to fca 166; campos cows, secondary quality, sold at fca 132.

Salted hides without sales. The first cargo of Rio Grande is of inferior quality, the hides, though not quite matadero, being scarcely saladero; average value fca 75 to 77. In Buenos Ayres or Uruguay hides no business. In England 7 1/2, perhaps 7d would be accepted for Rio Grande, and 8 1/2, perhaps 8d for Uruguay. The cause of this decline is the unwillingness of importers to hold their hides, in fear of heavy shipping later on in the season. If the news about this drought in the provinces turn out true, so as to leave us this year with a deficit of from 200,000 to 300,000 hides, we may expect to see better prices later on in the year.
