The sums to be voted for Immigration, Post-office, Telegraphs &c. cause an increase of \$700,000 in the Department of Interior; the said votes include the cost of a new Immigrant Asylum (£30,000 sterling). new Post-office (£22,000) and new Telegraph office (£13,000). The other Departments of Government shew a saving of nearly 3 millions as compared with the predent year. The last year was one of unusual activity, constructing 4 railways, 4 provincial highways, 1 road over the Andes, 3 bridges, a custom-liouse, repairs of 22 colleges, embankment at give Santiago, and experimental channel for the port of B.
