STANT'S PORT SCHEME.

To the Editors of the STANDARD. Gentlemen.

In your yesterday's date I observe you have kindly mentioned the port scheme I have presented to Congress for leave to construct at the Boca, and you wish for further information. I would beg you to refer to the peti-

tion presented, as it is too lengthy for me to expect its insertion; but in reply to yours:-

My proposed port scheme is no revival whatever of Sr. Don Manuel Lynch's; neither does it intertere with Messrs. Bateman's and Madero's port schemes, but is entirely my own project, based upon a study during nearly four years' residence here; and not a doubt can exist of its practicability, reclaiming waste swampy lands.

As to the depth of water, at Barracas Bridge at the present and all times there are 14 feet of water, and, as you say, only 7 feet outside the Boca. Granted; then by dredging 7 feet it would produce a dock 14 teet deep, or on the same level; but by dredging (say from Barracas Bridge) 6 feet of mud, and carrying out the same level, 27 feet. This is very simply seen.

The fact of Bateman's or any other channel in front of Buenos Ayres filling up is simply because it has no back rise and fall of tide backing its water £800 worth of silver, and is still giv. the greatest ease. up the Riachuelo for miles; and hours ing good work. after the tide has receded a strong current of water may be seen coming mines, has been very badly worked, from the Riachuelo.

Therefore, instead of following the tortuous form of the river, which stones which I have seen will give 75 Messrs. Huergo and Revy aid, I plant per cent of silver. Chilecito, Rioja, 30th June 1874. Messrs. M. G. & E. T. Mulhall, Dear Sirs,

I take this occasion to inform you of some differences which I observe in this district of Famatina, between my last visit-just twelve months sinceand the present.

Twelve months ago, the mines in actual working order were few and far between, and these worked only with forces ranging from 4 to 10 men including the 'mayordomo' and the cook; the only exceptions being the San Pedro d'Alcantara and the Upulungo, the former with 50 and the latter with 20, but now my prognostication will be verified, viz, that this district would before long cause a sensation in the mining world.

As you will perhaps remember in October 1872 I obtained from the Provincial Government a concession of privileges for working 20 mines in this district. On my visit, in June 1873, I was much pressed for time, and consequently could not examine the various fields, as carefully as I wished, so only selected 9 mines which pleased me, and which were, I knew, consider ed favorite mines by the residents, and a number of others I noted as well deserving a careful examination. when I returned, but, on my return, I find even in this short time such has been the interest taken in mining, not only by the residents, but also by strangers, since the appearance of my rought report in your columns, that many of these mines have been taken by others. I have already increased my number to 15, and the more I examine, the more am I pleased with

in general. I will now proceed to point out a few differences in the aspect of the
