FATTENING CATTLE.

A letter from a friend in Rosario which we publish in another column suggests the reflection that there is room for a very profitable business in fattening cattle for the B. Avres market. It is admitted on all hands that the beef of this country, though inferior to that of England, is peculiarly savoury and palatable when properly treated; but owing to the long distances traversed by cattle befor reaching town the meat is generally poor, flabby and disposed to generate fevers. How different the rib of roast-beef that you

get from an 'asador' in the camp! Messrs. Llavallol and Co. have laid lown a farm of 1,000 acres of alfalfa near Rosario to fatten beef for our market, and the first results of the speculation are so promising that we may hope to see a dozen such farms promptly started within easy reach of B. Ayres. The cattle which were bought six months ago at 25 to 30 Bolivian dollars, have just been disposed of by Messrs. Llavallol at 60\$ Bolper head (say £10 sterling) to purveyors from our city, who find they can not only pay so high a price but also the

About three years ago the Munici-About three years and the whole pality of Paris fried to sell the whole the losses, of course, are very severe. The sales panty of Laris and feces by public to-day reached over one million one hundred auction. There were French, English, Belgian and German Companies, who market. came as bidders and an English Company got it for the price of 51 francs for each Cubic meter of dirty Stuff, delivered to them, besides this payment the Company had to engage itself not to treat the Matter in any way which would annoy neighbours, therefore they were not allowed to dry the stuff in the open air, or to burn it or to throw it into any ditch or river. Besides this the company had to accept any quantity of vasura that was sent to them from the city and the contract was to last for 15 years.

By subsequent arrangements the price was reduced to 21 francs per cubic meter, and at this rate the company has now been paying for a length of time for 1,500 cubic meters per day about 3,750 francs every day to the city

Now the way in which the English company makes money is the tollow-

It is well known that feces, urine ing: and 'basura' contain ammonia, and it is equally well known that ammonia will combine with sulphuric acid, forming a valuable salt called sulphate of ammonia, which crystalises and is hard and white like soda, and which sold well last year at 40 francs per 100 lbs. Moreover it is well known that am-

monia will leave the liquid or solid matter in which it is contained, as soon as heat is applied, distilling much easier and quicker than water. Consequently the English company in Paris throws the 'vasura' into a boiler, which communicates with a leaden tank containing diluted sulphuric acid. Heat is applied, the ammonia distils, and is recovered from the leaden tank as sulphate of ammonia.
