

tion purposes. This Grand Canal was to be of a uniform width of of 35 feet by 41 deep, so as to allow vessels of 50 tons, that is, each vessel would enrry 25 bullockcart loads. The projectors, Messrs. Gowland, Van Prat and Guerrico, esmated the cost, including bridges, at £10,000 per mile. As the canal would be over 100 miles long the cost would be about a million sterling. 'The advantages would possibly exceed those

of a railway of the same length-1. Affording cheaper transit for produce through all the thekly settled districts between Chivilcoy, Tigre and Barracas.

2. Providing constant irrigation, the waters of the Luxan and a portion of the Parana being diverted by sluices &c. into the valley of Matanzas.

3. The Riachuelo being converted into a river of much importance, and thus made more serviceable for the trade of B. Ayres.

Such a canal as the above seems to us of more practical utility than the 4 projected at present in the Legislature. Canals are apparently as easy and cheap to construct as railways in a flat country like ours. They have also the advantage of cheap freight and trifling working expenses. Anybody who has ever travelled through the flat provinces of Flanders or Holland must have seen how useful canals are in those countries.
