A fall in price was anticipated, as business in France, America, and England was checked. People bought wool in Antwerp, therefore, with gre t caution, and about the beginning of July a rise of 15 continues on February prices was established. The great London auction began 28th April, and the great fall in price so much approhen led was limited to 5 per cent. on March prices. Our auction began next day, and with a drop of 10 cents. Our stock was then 23,769 bales. Importers, in order to stop the fall at which the auction opened, withdrew large lots, and this at one brought up prices to 10 per cent. over February prices. At the end of May our stock stood at 26,664 bales. All through June business ruled brisk enough, and the Germans and French bought largely. Our stock on the 30th June stoot at 30,527 tales. Our imports for the first half of the present year show an increase of 17,000 balos. The hide market shows great improvement: salted hides are scarce.


