OBITUARY.

THE LATE GEN. ALEXANDER TATE.

This distinguished gentleman breathed his last on Saturday evening, at his reside co in Cal-Florids, after a lingering illness of soveral months' duration. Having only come to Buenos Avres at the beginning of the present year, he was little known in Buenos Ayreau Society Although a young man, his career had been an eventful one. He was born at Aux Cayes, near Port-au-Prince, the capital of Hayti, on Now Year's Day, 1830, in the time of the famou-Emperor Sou'ovque. His father was a Scotch merchant of Port-au-Prince, his mother a Haytion creole: he was educated at the Lycca. where he laid the foundation of a sup rior English and French education, which he subs quently perfected by patient study and self-

Twenty years ago Captain Taté was one of the handsomest men in his city, holding a combeen named Manager of the branch of mision in Pres. Goffcard's body-guard. With the fall of Geffrard he retired into private life. but under the Salnave Government was chosen Colonel of the National Guard. Having aided Salnave to suppress a revolution, in the course of which he was sever by wounded in storming a fortress, he was in ide Minister of Foreign Affairs, and we believe at different times acted as Judge-Advocate-General of the Army and Minister of Finance. We forgot to observe that under the Goffrard Administration he had been sent to the United States to negotiate the removal of libe rated slaves to Hayti. He even offered President Lincoln his services to organise a colored 'corps d'armee' to fight against the South, but for sevoral reas as this offer was declined. In November, 1869, he was named Haydian Minister Ple nipotentiary to President Grant's Government, and his arrival at Washing on was regarded in tracts requiring no mining, and is said the United States as an event of some im-
