THE LATE M. GUIZOT.

Telegrams vesterday from Europe brought us the announcement of the death of the great French statesman and writer, François Pierre Guizot. who held power for sixteen years during the reign of Louis Philip, and has enriched the literature of France and England by several works of lasting

merit. He was born October 4th, 1787, at Nismes, where his father was a law yer and perished on the scaffold among so many of the old French nobility. Being of a Protestant family, he was educated at Geneva where he became well versed not only in ancient classics, but in the German. English and Italian languages. He was eighteen years of age when he repaired to Paris to embrace his fa editress of a magazine called the Pr- ried. bliciste, who was fourteen years his senior; and the same year obtained the chair of Modern History in the Sorbonne. He had already published "Lives. of the French Poets" and translated Gibbon's "Decline and Fal of the Roman Empire." For fifteen years his house in the Rue St. Dominique was the resort of the most dis tinguished men of the day in politics misfortune to lose his wife.




