The decree in question defines their responsibilities clearly, and we recommend its perusal to all who may be thinking of 'hairbreadth 'scapes,' etc.

The Italian residents have started a subscription for the widow Bustica, whose husband was killed the other day, and to whom Pres. Sarmiento gave 600 pats.

Mesdames Biancolini and Stella Bonheur, the well known artists, left this city on Thursday for Europe. The fiddle can now be played by telegraph, as will be seen in the following extract from a late exchange:—"The writer has heard music played on a small melodeon, or piano keyboard, transmitted through an unbroken circuit of 2,400 miles, and reproduced on a violin attached to the receiving end of the wire. Mr. Gray played 'Hail Columbia,' 'The Star Spangled Banner,' 'God Save the Queen,' 'Yankee Doodle,' and other well-known airs, and they were unmistakably repeated, note for note, on the violin, which lay on a table near at hand.
