Our esteemed colleague La Union Argentina publishes the following eloquent tribute to the memory of the late Don Andres Lamas, Junr.—

"Death has cut down at its dawn a life devoted to advance the prosperity of the Republic of the River Plate.

"It is barely a month ago since business of importance called him to Rio de Janeiro, and when returning in the boat, with his wife and children, he died. Death has respected nothing, neither youth, family nor friends have been able to save him from the ruthless Scyllie.

"Everything has ended in a second of Time—Youth, dreams of greatness, energy, infinite love of country; gigantic financial projects, all the ardent and original aspirations in the warm heart of our friend have been dashed to the ground by a premature death.

"All is over for him; but his parents, his loving wife, beloved children and the friends who were witnesses of his public and private worth remain. May he never forget him, or that his death is a great loss to the Argentine Republic.

"We offer our most sincere condolences to the relatives of our friend."

The annual contest between Scotch farmers and Scotch thistles has commenced, with the odds in favour of the thistles.

One hundred and seventeen persons died of starvation in London within the past twelve months. Emigration to all quarters of the earth is increasing. To New Zealand alone the exodus is now 30,000 souls per annum, all free or assisted passages.

During the month of September the City of Buenos Ayres Trauway Company carried 473,432 passengers.

M. Stephan, Director of the Marcellis Observatory, says the new Comet is pretty bright, and moving towards the West. Length of tail 25 millions of miles.

There is talk of two new French papers being started in this city, one by a company, the other by a private party.

The last census in Brazil gives the empire a population of 11,896,000 souls. There are 36 agricultural colonies, the annual exportation from which is valued at £240,000 stg.

At the meeting of the National Senate on Thursday Dr. Rawson asked leave to take a trip to foreign parts with his family, on private affairs, which was granted by 14 votes to two.

The Policia publishes a list of the various fines imposed on individuals for misdemeanors during the month of September. The lowest was 20¢ for cracking a whip.

A new and useful Society is projected in the city—La Humanitaria—whose programme is as follows:—To maintain a staff of nurses of both sexes, to watch the sick night and day; to conduct funerals, and have attendants ready at all hours for the sick or infirm people.

The Municipality has again sent a pressing note to the Government on the subject of the Chacarita Cemetery, which is now chock full, and more room for graves must be immediately found.

The office of Messrs. MacLean, Bell and Co. was broken into on Thursday night, and several valuable parcels and other articles were taken away.

The safe was found on the Paseo de Julio, at the corner of Calle Tucuman, completely smashed, and some packages of jewellery contained in same have not turned up.

There was the best possible let down in the Cedula market to-day, and upon the whole the market ruled weaker to-day than yesterday.

There is a great complaint about the banks, and some of the most experienced merchants consider that if the banks tighten the cords too much there will be a snap, regular trade bills it seems are off-ree in the market and can't be discounted.

The auriferous camps of Cuiapira evince daily proofs to the mineralogist, that the character of the minerals clearly predicts manifestations of a change into copper and silver compounds, ultimately the development of this important branch of industry will have the attention of mining speculators in various parts of the world, on the ground of the great and independent of this Republic depend.

Secondly to prove the magnitude and value of the vast resources existing under a cap of mica Slate Porphyry and Metamorphic formation, the first pertaining to the 'primery' the 2nd last to the secondary epochs of the plutonic ages, requires capital in combination with scientific practitioners who have studied the career and success of similar camps; mineralogical covariant with the minerals of Chile, Mexico, and Lower California, visiting Cuiapira, must admit if they are practical observers that the rich mineral deposits here are to be found below the metamorphic formation; at this point the mineral according to every indication change their character into copper and silver compounds.

Thirdly, in consequence of reasons demonstrated it is advisable that this depth should be reached in order to ascertain the class of ore that the mine is likely to produce, as the upper body comprehending the surface and metamorphic formations pertains only to the gold deposits, the secondary body or primary formation producing copper and silver. Mr. Rogers a year ago discovered argenticiferous formation with copper compounds in the mine titled Descubridor at the depth of eighty feet, and four months ago the same gentleman discovered a vein of copper containing argenticiferous compounds in the Hill of Hanckenon, formation 'Mica Slate, Plutonic,' thus adding another characteristic proof that the leading minerals of Cuiapira are truly represented in the preceding article.

Fourthly, I add that this defective illustration can only be considered as a rough outline of the abstract that the mineral camps of Cuiapira manifest considerable advantage to mining capitalists, in virtue of which actuates me in support of the merits due to this report.

In the course of the London sales, several calm days came to pass, an occurrence which, though happening at many large auctions, still tends to show that the late rise was perhaps somewhat or done. Con in on at buyers complain of the trade, and as very reserved, leaving the bur. of the unusually heavy offerings in London to English competitors exclusively. By this reason, stocks in Liverpool have slightly augmented, having alone holding as much as 17,000 bales, whereof 12,000 be. River Plate wool.

Thus it may be said that on the whole there is more calm just now. Still the effects of cheap breadstuffs and low bank rates combined, will soon, we hope, enable sentimental buyers to purchase more freely at the London sales, and if, joined to this, the long looked for demand from America sets in, we may expect to see present prices maintained for some time yet.

On our market demand continued good, still transactions fell off somewhat, which circumstances must however be attributed principally to the stringency of holders.
