Auctions were held here yesterday, and out of 2,925 bales catalogued, 1,670 ba. were sold, leaving a stock in importers' hands of 2,250 ba. Compared with the prices paid at the auction on 30th July a decline of 1d to 1 1/2 p. was established.

Various causes have contributed to bring about this result, the chief amongst them being the recent arrival of the Thales and Leibnitz, with 1,000 ba. skins, a considerable portion being new, but the balance on the River as to probable shipments, those arrivals caused no surprise, but following immediately upon circumstantial reports as to the impossibility of shipments being made, they unsettled the buyers, and led them to think that the new skins will henceforward arrive freely; we think, however, that some time must elapse before our market is freely supplied.

Regular reports, by cable, of the shipments made would work to the advantage of both importers and customers. Our stock was also increased by the import of 650 bales from Antwerp and Bordeaux, and also by a quantity placed on the market by a local fellower, whose yard is imperceptibly closed owing to a fire which occurred in it. The result of this auction plainly indicates the probable course of prices when imports take place upon a free sale.
