UNITED STATES. Our trade with the U. States shows an increase of 25 per cent during the interval from 1870 to 1873, notwithstanding a considerable decline in our exports to that country.

The only falling-off in American imports is in the following two articles: Flour: in the three years ending 1872 we imported 1420 tons, and in 1873 only 13 tons.

ITALY. The new period before us shows a prodigious increase of trade with Italy, say 110 per cent, the total trade rising from \$2,500,000 in 1870 to \$5,300,000 in 1873.

Here we find all the principal articles have doubled, while some have increased ten-fold. If we descend to lower items we find shoes have fallen off amazingly, last year's returns being only one-tenth of those of 1871.

Cheese is almost stationary, the importation from Italy regularly averaging 150 tons yearly, although last year it reached 190 tons. This shows the Goya people were too busy with revolutions to supply our market, but surely the Santa Fe colonies (paying no duty) ought to be able to shut out cheese from Lombardy; but for the land-freight the Tucuman cheese would easily compete.

Eggs: we imported in three years no fewer than 240,000 from Italy, and the present average is 500 dozen monthly. This shows a great deficiency on the part of native hens, and suggests that we ought rather import poultry than eggs.

Musical instruments are increasing rapidly, which is a good sign, unless it be that they are horns for tramway guards. Soap also shows a wonderful rise; but why not make our own soap? Butter has slipped out of the market altogether, doubtless because of the Santa Fe colonies.

THE SITUATION. SIXTY-THIRD DAY. President Avellaneda issued a decree yesterday appointing Dr. Machado Attorney-General for the Federal Court of Buenos Ayres in room of Dr. Zavalia.

Minister Del Valle writes that this makes up 20,000 men raised in this Province for the war, and says 20,000 more will be raised if necessary.

The Tribune says that General Mitre's army is scattering in all directions about Sierra Tinta. When Colonel Julio Campos approached Blanca Grande, where General Rivas had left a small garrison under Major Puebla, the garrison declared for Campos.

Colonel Julio Campos in a despatch dated 22nd instant reports the submission of the commander and garrison of Port Lavalle, and adds that he expects the soldiers of the south frontier will ere long declare for the Government, and hand over their chief, Enrique Spika, in irons.

In a despatch dated Cerro Negro, 20th inst. Colonel Julio Campos says: "Hearing that the enemy were at Olabarria I marched all night of the 17th and reached the pass of the river before daybreak."

A later despatch on the same day from Azul, says—"After writing the above from Cerro Negro I came on to Azul, hearing that the enemy were no longer going towards Mar Chiquita but pushing along by Fort Perdido and Otamendi, with the apparent purpose of making for Quequen Grande or Bahía Blanca."

As soon as the enemy felt my approach they went along the foot of the Sierra to Cerro Negro, on the route for Taiten; then marched as if for Bahía Blanca, and again turned towards Tortosa, camping on Iraloa's estancia, district of Suarez, about 25 leagues from Azul.

My informants say the enemy do not exceed 2,500 men, although they seem much more at night when they light the camp-fires, every 3 men being allowed a sheep for dinner. It seems they are supposed to be going towards Lobosier. Rivas marches no longer at the head, but in the centre with the 4th of the Line and 'caballadas'. It is possible the enemy may change his direction, but if I do not hear from your Excellency I shall resume active operations to-morrow, Sunday 22nd. Annexed is a list of the prisoners taken with Catriel."

Colonel Lagos writes from Olabarria, Nov. 19th, that when he captured Catriel and his followers he had some trouble to save the lives of Avenidaño and Sosa, as the former, who is Catriel's interpreter, is supposed to have been for many years the instigator of Indian forays, and Sosa is said to be the man who cut the throat of a parliamentarian sent by Lagos to summon the Indians to surrender."

A GREAT LARK. The Tribune of yesterday reproduces in full our article of May 10th called "The World in 1874," being a comparative glance at all the nations of the earth as in the statistical returns of the 'Statesman's Year-book,' brought up by Captain Hairy of the steamer Leibnitz. The Tribune praises the article beyond measure, but says it is from the Foreign Times, a paper we never before heard of. But what particularly astonishes the Tribune is the flattering manner in which such important publications as the 'Statesman's Year-book' and Foreign Times speak of the Argentine Republic.

A correspondent asks whether anything has been done of late in the River Plate to promote hunting in the English fashion by the importation of hounds. He understands that in many parts herds of deer are found roaming wild, but that galloping is rendered dangerous owing to the ground being covered with a kind of rabbit burrow.

The Club owes a debt of gratitude both to these gentlemen and to Messrs.
