The idea of exploding gunpowder by the agency of electricity dates from the time of Franklin, but the first attempt to apply it to torpedo purposes appears to have been made by the Confederates in America, and it has recently been very fully developed. Electrical torpedoes are connected

with the shore by a cable of copper wire and guttapercha, communicating with a galvanic battery on shore.

The torpedo is fired by means of an electric fuze, known as the platinum wire fuze, in which a small strand of engines, which are worked by a replatinum wire is rendered red hot by servoir of compressed air.
