With a population of two millions she exports cereals, vegetables, and hay to the value of two militons pounds sterling, metals to

the value of three and a quarter millions, besides large quantities of honey, wax, cheese, butter, lard, linse d, jerked beef, hides, and timber. Large quantities of oil and native wine are exported to Bolivia, and beer is largely brewed by German settlers. "The Argentines are becoming aware of their deficiency in respect of agricultural production and as the settlers in the Southern Provinces of

the Consederation devote themselves more to the cultivation of cer. als, Chili will loss one of her neighbouring markets for broadstuffs. Already there has been a serious falling off in the quanity of grain exported, and the quantity of flour is also likely to decrease before many years are over. In 1868 the export of flour and wheat to the East rn Republics was valued at about \$900,000, while the total export of both articles for just year was but \$150,000.
